

The Transfer Credit System (TCS)

is used to create & maintain course-to-course articulations in the BC Transfer Guide



The TCS

provides tools that enables the management of all course -to-course articulation activities within PSI - including out of province & international. Currently over 350,000 C2C equivalencies

API Suite

Suite of additional APIs that enable PSIs (and other Provinces) to connect and work in real time with data from the TCS






TCS Enhancements Over the Years



- Support for EAL, ABE and additional transfer mechanisms




BC Transfer Guide Over the Years



- Requests that are informed by student mobility
- Evaluations that are informed by Artificial Intelligence
- Workflows automations informed by Research
- Systems that draw in rather than push you out






