Business Arising – Textbook, Collision Repair and Refinishing third edition has just been release. BCIT has gone back to Autobody Repair Technology sixth edition, found that the current textbook does not cover enough information. VCC using I-CAR curriculum and student textbook, cannot teach all areas with just I-CAR. UFV, CNC and OC to evaluate the third edition release and discuss with group at next meeting

I-CAR and the ARA update, little has come about regarding the ARA's center of excellence and I-CAR partnership for training industry towards Gold Class and OEM certification. Startup costs and equipment needs are presenting a challenge as well as Color Compass Group coming online with their own training center. ARA is launching their accreditation programs for collision and glass, the group will continue to watch this and see how it rolls out.
