4. Approval of Previous Minutes of the Articulation Committee meeting of May, 2023

5. **Chair report**

Jacqueline Kampman

There was a summary report of the activities of the annual BCCAT JAM event in November, including the issue of AI being used in the classroom.

-Note that not only committee chairs can attend but others too, including some online activities -check out moodle for link for this year's meeting.

6. New Issues:

- a. Discussion of CPBC and registration logistics for students (e.g., undergraduate course requirements). Ongoing student queries in Alberta about CAP registration and whether our courses and instructors meet their requirements. (Request by Trevor H. Gilbert Athabasca University).
 - -Some discussion was made, most comments that this does not affect the transfers and issues of this committee. Question came from the Albertan issues were referred back.
- b. Discussion of 2nd year stats/research course contents across our institutions. (Request by Dianne Crisp KPU).
 - -The question of content for the 2nd year stats courses was raised regarding research components.
 - -Discussion of various chapters to be included continued eg. Frequency distributions,

probability, confidence intervals, central tendency measures, Z-scores, p-statistics, hypothesis testing, t-statistics and ANOVA, also repeated measures and correlation and Chisquare. Not fully the same topics across institutions were reported.

- -UNBC has 2 semesters with a lab; UVIC 2 semesters in third year; TRU stats and methods separate.
- -Suggestion for methods be fore stats for most institutions.

- -Debbie Matheson raised the question for next year to report on the topics of honours theses.
- -Question of critical thinking and AI was raised including the detection of AI and analyzing content (will be brought up later in presentation by Kristina Andrew.
- c. Issue of Publishers paying for coffee or part of meeting, what do they get back (Request by Dianne Crisp KPU).
 - -Discussion was made and the following resolution was developed:
 - "Publishers can contribute to the psychology articulation meeting by sponsoring food or PD presenters. In return, they can have a table with publisher's materials in a separate room from the articulation meeting, but they will not be allowed to present proprietary products within the meeting itself."

- d. International Student Cap
 - -May have some impact but not likely to be substantial
 - -UVIC reports a real drop in international students
 - -Debbie Hlady (SLP) reports that government gives FTE targets and base funding but never enough funding for FTEs therefore International Students are supplemental to FTE targets over base funding.
 - -Jan White raised that "Brand Canada" has been started for fall recruitment by federal government with more attention for domestic recruitment.
