1. WELCOME & OPENING REMARKS

We would like to begin by acknowledging that the land on which we gather is the unceded territory of the Coast Salish peoples, including the territories of the x^wməðkwəýəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Stó:lō and Səlílwəta?/Selilwitulh (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations.

Rob Fleming (Co-Chair) and Kathy Denton (Acting Co-Chair) opened the meeting, welcoming new Council members and guests from the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training: Jamie Edwardson (Executive Director, Planning, International and Intergovernmental Branch) and Randall Gerlach (Director, Intergovernmental Relations).

1.1. Council Membership: New Appointments and Re-appointments

Rob announced the reappointments of Jim Hamilton, Verna Billy-Minnabarriet, Brian Dick, Rummana Khan Hemani, Karen McCredie, Tami O'Meara, and Carolyn Russell.

He then welcomed the newly appointed members: Dorys Crespin-Mueller, Gerda Krause, Brenda Louie, Ashley Millar, Diane Naugler, and Steve Roe.

1.2. BCCAT Staff Team

Rob informed members of recent changes to the BCCAT staff team:

- Fiona McQuarrie returns as Special Projects Coordinator, on secondment from the University of the Fraser Valley
- Adina Dropol is our new Office Coordinator
- Adam Bielka is a Coop Student, stepping in this year as Research and Policy Assistant.

Rob also noted that Meg Stainsby will be starting her PhD in Creative Writing shortly, and will be working remotely from Wales for six months in October-November. During this period, Mike Winsemann will also be reducing his hours with EducationPlannerBC, and returning full time to BCCAT.

2. ADOPTION OF PROPOSED AGENDA

The agenda was adopted as presented.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING (June 7-8, 2018)

Rob noted that all action items from the previous meeting are executed or on today's agenda for follow up except the logo policy which is being considered in relation to the redesign of the BCCAT.ca website. The minutes of the 127th meeting held on June 7-8, 2018 were accepted as presented.

4. COUNCIL BUSINESS

4.1. Provincial Issues and Developments

4.1.1. Ministry Update

Jamie Edwardson and Randall Gerlach provided a brief update from the Ministry, touching on organizational/structural changes, key priorities, K-12 transitions (working with the Ministry of Education), and Indigenization in the post-secondary system.

4.1.2. Degree Quality Assessment Board (DQAB) Update

(NOTE: Brenda Louie recused herself from the following discussion.)

Robert Fleming reported that Columbia College has notified the DQAB and BCCAT of a planned change in operational structure so will be seeking renewed ministerial consent. If ministerial consent is granted the change is not likely to impact BC Transfer Guide agreements as the school would continue to offer the same curriculum under the operational name of Columbia College. Rob noted that the new president (Robin Hemmingsen) has been installed following the recent retirement of Trevor Toone.

4.1.3. Learning Modernization Initiative

4.1.3.1. Ministry of Education fora

Plans are underway for two sessions to focus on discussions regarding the Learning Modernization Initiative. The first (planned for November 6, 2018) will feature an update from the Ministry of Education for post-secondary institutions, and an opportunity to share responses to date. The event will be held in conjunction with SAAF. Details to follow shortly.

4.1.3.2. SFU's Developing Minds Symposium

Meg Stainsby and Rob Fleming attended this symposium hosted by SFU last year. Both noted these events as excellent opportunities for dialogue across the secondary and post-secondary systems. The event allows participants to share from different philosophies, all recognizing the importance of developing critical thinking for students. 4.2. Staff Report to Council on External Activities

The Staff Report on External Activities provides an overview of key activities undertaken by BCCAT staff. Rob Fleming highlighted the following points:

- Considerable staff time is spent on work related to Ministry-related projects (such as EPBC), conferences and other system meetings, DQAB, and research projects.
- Several BCCAT staff members participated at the PCCAT conference in PEI in June.

4.3. Projects & Activities Chart

The 2018-19 Projects & Activities Chart is provided to the Council on a quarterly basis as a regular update relating to the 2018-19 Work Plan, approved at the June 2018 meeting. Members accepted this update, and there were a few questions regarding issues and challenges which can sometimes entail delays for certain projects, such as low responses to Calls for Proposals, and external projects (e.g. EPBC) that may affect staff workload. Overall, projects and activities are on track.

4.4. BCCAT Transfer Awards

Valerie Yorkston presented the report and recommendation of the Awards Committee regarding the 2018 BCCAT Transfer Awards. The report outlined the nomination and adjudication process, providing brief profiles for each nominee under consideration for an award.

Following review of the report, members voted unanimously to approve the recommendations, and to present the 2018 BCCAT Transfer Awards to the following awardees:

MOTION: To approve the recommendations of the Awards Committee regarding the winners of the 2018 BCCAT Transfer Awards.

The awards will be presented at the 2018 Joint Annual Meeting on November 16, 2018.

In addition, the Awards Committee proposed changes regarding process and communications/documentation for the purposes of better clarity regarding distinctions between award categories, and a more robust nomination and endorsement process. These changes were approved in principle with the suggestion that the committee work out a protocol for informing appropriate administrative staff of nominees from their institutions Members also agreed that increased attention should be given to raising awareness about the Rising Star award, encouraging nominations wherever appropriate.

5. TRANSFER & ARTICULATION

5.1. Transfer & Articulation Committee - TAC (Last Meeting: September 21, 2018) Eric Davis, Chair of the TAC, provided a brief overview of discussions at the last TAC meeting. Draft minutes from the meeting will be provided at the December meeting of Council. Eric noted the recent addition of two new members, Diane Naugler and Dezene Huber.

They also recommended that this list be passed to the Deans groups for their information.

In closing, Adam Bielka informed members about a project he is working on, looking at articulation committee attendance.

5.3. 2018 Joint Annual Meeting – November 16, 2018

Planning and preparation for the 2018 Joint Annual Meeting is well underway. Ruth reported that we have 80 registrations to date. - Issues and Challenges in Interdisciplinary Course and Program Transfer This report is undergoing a few, minor, late changes, but is expected to be published this fall.

5.5. How to Articulate Handbook

Meg presented the 2018 edition of the How to Articulate Handbook which has been updated to align with changes to the BC Transfer Guide and policy developments in recent years. 7.2. Research Projects

7.2.1. Contemporary Issues Projects

At the June 2018 meeting of Council (Item 7.3.1) it was agreed that BCCAT staff would consider guidelines for requests from authors of "Contemporary Issues" studies to publish final reports on the BCCAT website.

Council members raised a number of issues and questions for consideration, expressing some concern that the BCCAT website should not function as a "library" or repository. This issue will be looked at by the Research Committee at the next meeting.

8. TECHNOLOGIES

8.1. EducationPlannerBC.ca (EPBC)

Kathy Denton gave an update regarding discussions at the Presidents' meeting, Steering Committee and Working Group. EPBC is in the process of transitioning to a non-profit society. As a result, there are several associates who have been involved in the initial stages of development and planning that will be less involved in this next phase. On behalf of the EPBC committees, Kathy expressed appreciation to Mike Winsemann for his hard work and commitment throughout the planning, development and launch of the EPBC application platform.

8.2. BCCAT.ca Enhancements Project

BCCAT is working with Bayleaf on a refresh and redesign of the BCCAT.ca website with a view to improving search functionality and making BCCAT projects and publications easier to navigate.

8.3. BCTransferGuide.ca External Review

BCCAT has contracted with Plaid Consulting to undertake an external review of the BCTransferGuide.ca website. The findings of this project are expected to inform enhancements in the 2019-20 fiscal year.

9. INTER-PROVINCIAL ISSUES & DEVELOPMENTS - R. Fleming

9.1. CATCAN Network – Terms of Reference

CATCAN is what previously functioned as "WestCAT", bringing together Western Canadian "CATs" responsible for transfer and articulation in their respective jurisdictions. BCCAT staff members will be participating at an upcoming meeting in Calgary.

CATCAN has finalized its Terms of Reference (an extension of the latest MOU at <u>www.bccat.ca/pubs/PCCAT_MOU_2017.pdf</u>). Key collaborations will focus on technology (transfer databases) and research and data sharing.

9.2. Pan-Canadian Consortium on Admissions & Transfer (PCCAT)

Several BCCAT staff members (Rob Adamoski, Anna Tikina, Rob Fleming, and Mike Winsemann) participated at the PCCAT Conference in PEI on June 20-21, 2018. This conference was held jointly with ARUCC and CACUSS. Next year's conference will be held in Regina. It is expected that the CATCAN meeting will be held in conjunction with that event. 9.3. ARUCC/Groningen Communications
