


Who is included in this study?

RU Transfer Students are a subset of all mobile undergraduate students in BC who moved to 6 universities between 2013/14 and 2017/18.

constitute more than 1/3 of all students admitted in a year at the 6 universities (on average). Students from across the province take advantage of BC's transfer pathways.




Almost 1/4 of RU transfer students come from private BC Transfer System institutions.




Where do they transfer from?



Typical GPA Trends during Studies

After a drop in GPA by the end of the first semester at a Research University, the, GPA for both RU Transfer Students and students entering directly from high school improved significantly by graduation. Transfer students graduated with a GPA comparable to the direct-entry students' GPA.


