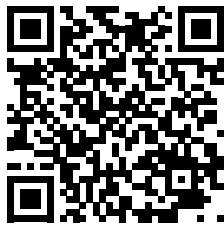

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As the continuation of research studies conducted by the British Columbia Council of Admission and Transfer (BCCAT) on transfer students every five years, this report highlights the pathways and successes of the students who were admitted to public universities in British Columbia – Capilano University (CapU), Kwantlen Polytechnic University (KPU), Royal Roads University (RRU), Simon Fraser University (SFU), Thompson Rivers University (TRU), University of British Columbia Vancouver (UBCV) and Okanagan (UBCO) campuses, University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC), University of the Fraser Valley (UFV), University of Victoria (UVic) – during the period 2018/19 to 2022/23 academic years. The profile and performance of BC transfer students¹ were compared to the profile and performance of BC direct entry students.

The cumulative five-year total of BC transfer student numbers for this reporting period is 29,798, which is slightly lower than the 30,140 reported in the previous reporting period (2013/14-2017/18).

STUDENT PROFILE

- The cumulative five-year total of BC transfer student numbers for this reporting period is 29,798, which is slightly lower than the 30,140 reported in the previous reporting period (2013/14 – 2017/18). On the other hand, there was a slight but steady increase in direct entry students over the same period (73,680 in this report vs. 53,036 in 2020). Thus, the proportion of BC transfer students in the cohort declined to 29% from 36% in the previous reporting period. This could be attributed to expanding the study's scope to include more universities and to the institutional characteristics of these universities.

¹ The definition of "BC transfer students" in this report differs from the definition of mobile students in the Student Transitions Project <https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/post-secondary-education/data-research/student-transitions-project>. In the current study, BC transfer students were defined as students transferring 15 or more credits and transferring from a BC Transfer System member institution (including private and non-BC institutions). BC direct entry students were students who entered a receiving university after graduating from a BC high school. Appendix A contains the full list of definitions used in this report.

- Some sending institutions, such as Camosun College, KPU, Okanagan College and CapU, had a significant decrease in the number of BC transfer students between the two reporting periods. The expanding options for students to complete their post-secondary journey without transfer (e.g., the growth of the number of baccalaureate programs in almost all BC public post-secondary institutions) might have influenced these results. The COVID-19 pandemic happened during the latest reporting period, and it could be another factor that influenced transfer pathways and trends.
- As in previous years, students from the sending institutions in the Mainland/Southwest region constituted the majority (71%) of transfer students. This percentage was up from 68% in the last reporting period, likely due to the addition of transfer students at three more receiving universities located in the Mainland/Southwest. There was a decline in the number of international transfer students (e.g., from Fraser International College), likely connected to barriers facing international students starting programs during the pandemic and transferring post-pandemic.
- The two largest groups of BC transfer students were those at the start of second year (30-34 credits transferred at admission; 17% of transfer students) and at the start of the third year (60-64 credits transferred at admission; 20% of transfer students) of baccalaureate studies. There are significantly higher percentages of students transferring 60-64 or 65+ credits at admissions compared to the 2020 report's percentages in the same categories. The number of students transferring 65+ credits at admission almost doubled compared to 2020, with 2,203 students in the current study vs. 1,079 in the 2020 report. Transfer pathways that focus on transferring a higher number of completed credits (e.g., degree partnerships in nursing programs) could explain this finding.
- More BC direct entry students (60%) took 24-29 and 30-35 credits in their first 12 months compared to the transfer students (48%), implying a higher course load for direct entry students in the first year of studies. This finding is in line with the results of the previous studies.
- Like the previous period, more than half of the students (55% of BC transfer students and 58% of BC direct entry students) were enrolled in Arts and Sciences. The percentages of BC transfer students in Engineering and Applied Science programs, Health, and Human and Social Services were higher than corresponding percentages of BC direct entry students.
- The percentage of students self-identifying as Indigenous was 3% for both BC transfer and BC direct entry students. The percentage of transfer students decreased slightly from 4% in the previous reporting period, while the percentage for direct entry students remained the same.
- By national status, 9% of BC direct entry and 31% of BC transfer students were international. These percentages were higher than 4.4% and 27.1%, respectively, in the previous reporting period.

More than half of the students (55% of BC transfer students and 58% of BC direct entry students) were enrolled in Arts and Sciences.

The percentage of students self-identifying as Indigenous was 3% for both groups of students.

By national status, 9% of BC direct entry and 31% of BC transfer students were international.

- The majority for students older than 19, the BC transfer students were older than their BC direct entry counterparts, with an average age of 22.2, compared to 18.1. However, the transfer students were on average younger than those in the previous reporting period. Future studies will indicate whether the shift to younger students among the BC transfer student category was a phenomenon of increased mobility during the pandemic, or there are changes in transfer patterns to include pathways for younger students.
- 54% of BC transfer and 56% of BC direct entry students were identified as female. This is lower slightly from 55% and 57%, respectively, from the previous reporting period. The range of academic programs and disciplines at sending and receiving institutions, and their regional relevance are likely prominent factors that affect the percentage of females.

Future studies will indicate whether the shift to younger students among the BC transfer student category was a phenomenon of increased mobility during the pandemic, or there are changes in transfer patterns to include pathways for younger students.

Consistent with the findings in the 2020 report, after completing 15 credits (i.e., a proxy for about one semester of full-time studies) at the majority of receiving institutions (all except UBCV), BC transfer students had higher average GPAs than BC direct entry students at all receiving institutions.

PERFORMANCE

- On average, 75% of BC transfer students admitted in the 2018/19 academic year completed a degree by the end of the 2022/23 academic year, compared to 67% for BC direct entry students admitted in the 2016/17 academic year and graduated by the end of the 2022/23 academic year. This percentage was slightly higher than the results from the previous reporting period (72% of BC transfer students and 60% of BC direct entry students in the 2020 report).
- Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Sciences were the most common credentials for BC transfer students who got admitted in the 2018/19 academic year and graduated before the reporting period's end. About a half (44%) of transfer graduates completed a Bachelor of Arts degree compared to 32% of BC direct entry graduates. In contrast, a Bachelor of Science degree was the program of choice for more BC direct entry students (33%) than for BC transfer students (18%).
- Both BC Transfer students and BC direct entry students completed a credential within the same amount of time: about 29 months, implying that BC transfer students were reasonably effective in their studies post-transfer.
- The course grades confirm that the transfer students' performance was often similar to the direct entry students' performance. This was assessed in the second- and third-year level courses that are typically required for programs and have high enrolment of transfer students.

INTRODUCTION

Roughly every five years, the British Columbia Council on Admissions and Transfer (BCCAT) publishes a report on the demographic characteristics of transfer students and their post-transfer academic performance. Using data collected at the BC public universities, this report examines pathways and performance of transfer students from the BC Transfer System institutions into BC's public universities for the period 2018/19 to 2022/23 academic year.

BCCAT has commissioned similar studies and reporting for the last 35 years (Plaid Consulting, 2000; Lambert-Maberly, 2005; Tikina, 2015), with the previous edition completed in 2020. Results of these studies have been used in education research and academic program development in the province of British Columbia. Sending institutions of transfer students, primarily colleges, teaching intensive universities, and institutes with two-year transfer programs, use the report for program and curriculum development, student recruitment, and programs for student success. Universities receiving these students have used the information to fine-tune admission requirements, program planning, and success evaluation. Through the results of the studies, education researchers gain understanding of the transfer student population and the transfer environment in BC. They can also use the results to compare the BC system with other similar systems in Canada or the United States.

Before the 2010s, a typical transfer pathway took students from a BC college, institute or teaching-intensive university to a research-intensive university. The current knowledge of pathways (for example, Heslop, 2023) indicates that student's movement is more complex, and all BC public universities receive transfer students. Thus, the scope of the current study was extended to include all BC's public universities. Capilano University (CapU), Kwantlen Polytechnic University (KPU), and the University of the Fraser Valley (UFV) chose to participate in addition to the six universities of the Research University Council of BC (RUCBC) that had participated in earlier studies. Unlike the previous similar study (Plaid, 2020), UBC data were split by campus and are shown separately for UBC-Vancouver (UBCV) and UBC-Okanagan (UBCO). To ensure that this report can be compared easily with those from previous studies, we continue to focus on the overall success of transfer students following their transfer to BC public universities. The performance trends of transfer students are also compared with those of the direct entry students given that the demographics and educational journeys of these two groups of students are different.

Where data were available from the receiving universities, they were included in the analysis, graphs and tables. To ensure ready comparisons, the structure of the report follows the organization in the previous editions. The report begins an overview of the research project and contains three sections:

1. Section 1. The analysis of transfer student demographics and pathways, a comparison of the academic performance of direct entry students and transfer students, and a comparison of participation and performance of transfer students and direct entry students in specific courses.
2. Section 2 contains detailed data tables that supported the analysis in Section 1.
3. Appendices. The data definitions, the scope, and the methodology of the project are described in detail in [Appendix A](#). Course-level data are shown in [Appendices B-G](#) for courses that are typically required for programs and which have high enrolment of transfer students.

SECTION 1. RESULTS

STUDENT PROFILE

Number of Students

During the period 2018/19 – 2022/23, the number of transfer students in BC went through a period of growth between 2018/19 and 2020/21 increasing from 5,696 in 2018/19 to 6,827 in 2020/21. This increase could reflect the growth in the overall student enrolment during the pandemic years (2020–2021). However, two years following the sharp decline brought the population to its lowest level in the last 10 years at 4,974 in 2022/23 ([Figure 1](#)). The expanded scope of the report, with added numbers from three more receiving universities, did not offset this drop but smoothed the decline.

The decline could be linked to the significant drop in the number of international transfer students post-pandemic. Moreover, a changing political climate and immigration policies could be factors in the decline in the number of international transfer students. For example, at Fraser International College (FIC), Alexander College, or Coquitlam College where large proportions of the student population are international, the numbers of transferring out students decreased sharply: at FIC, from 1,123 students (2018/19) to 672 in 2022/23; at Alexander College, from 222 students at the peak in 2022/21 to 87 students in 2022/23, at Coquitlam College, from 222 in 2018/19 to 175 in 2022/23 ([Table 2](#)).

The pandemic 2020/21 year, when most courses were offered online, saw a sharp increase in the number of transfer students at UNBC ([Figure 1](#)). The number of transfer students at SFU and combined number for both UBC campuses (UBC–Vancouver, UBCV, and UBC–Okanagan, UBCO) was also larger in 2020/21 than in the previous years, but not so significantly as at UNBC. In 2022/23, the number of transfer students at UNBC appeared to return to its pre-pandemic levels; however, both SFU and UBC reported numbers of transfer students that were lower than the pre-pandemic numbers, possibly due to a decline in the number of international transfer students. While UVic transfer student numbers stayed relatively stable across two reporting periods 2013/14 – 2020/21, the numbers dropped and almost halved post-pandemic.

During the current reporting period, the number of transfer students reported by UBCV and UBCO and RRU was smaller each academic year than in the previous reporting period (2013/14 – 2017/18).

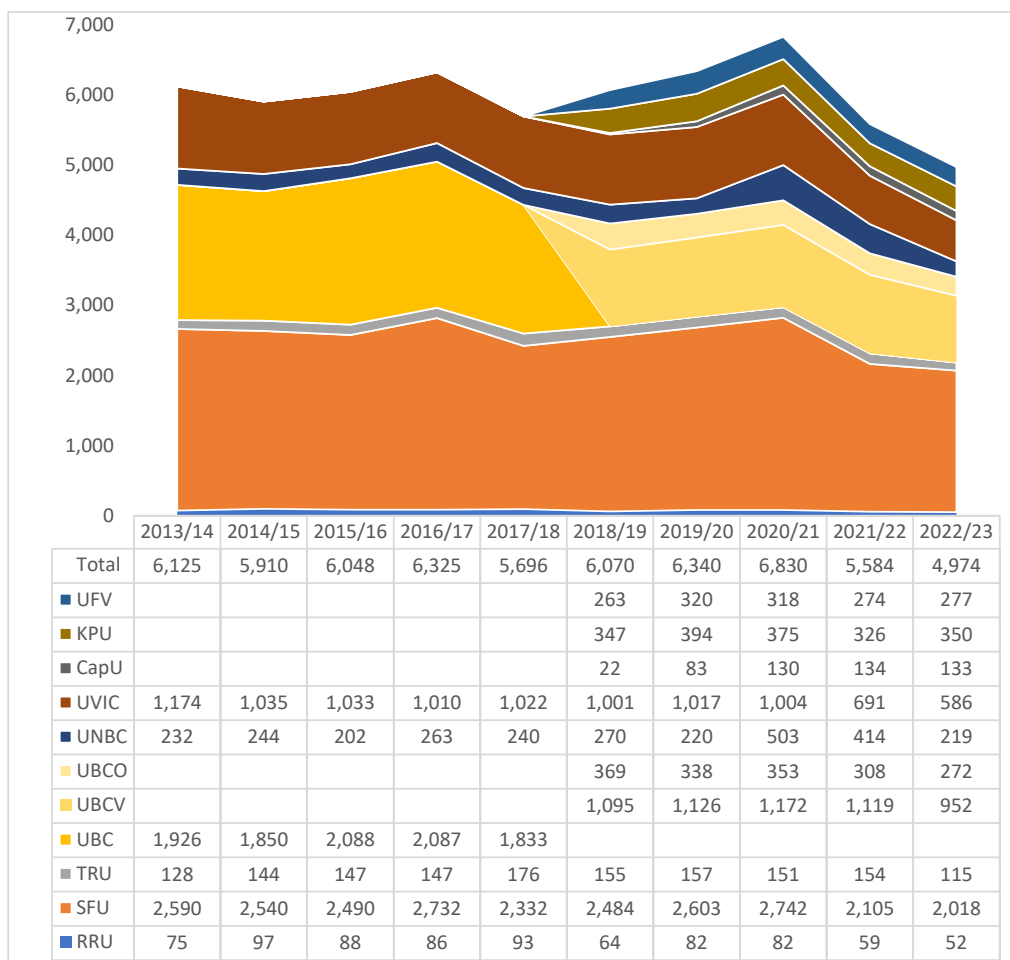
The cumulative five-year total of the BC transfer student numbers decreased slightly between the current reporting period and that reported in the 2020 version of this report (29,798 transfer students in this study vs. 30,104 in 2020) ([Table 2](#)). The numbers may reflect the trend of decreasing transfer rates in the BC public post-secondary institutions (Heslop, 2023), where students stay at one university for the whole duration of their program.

It is noted, however, that there was a small but steady increase in direct entry students over the same period. The number of reported direct entry students increased between these same periods (73,579 direct entry students in this report vs. 53,036 in 2020). This could be attributed to the expansion of the study's scope to include more universities and their features.

The cumulative five-year total of the BC transfer student numbers decreased slightly between the current reporting period and that reported in the 2020 version of this report (29,798 transfer students in this study vs. 30,104 in 2020).

The numbers may reflect the trend of decreasing transfer rates in the BC public post-secondary institutions (Heslop, 2024), where students stay at one university for the whole duration of their program.

Note: No split into campuses for UBC 2013/14 – 2017/18 data.

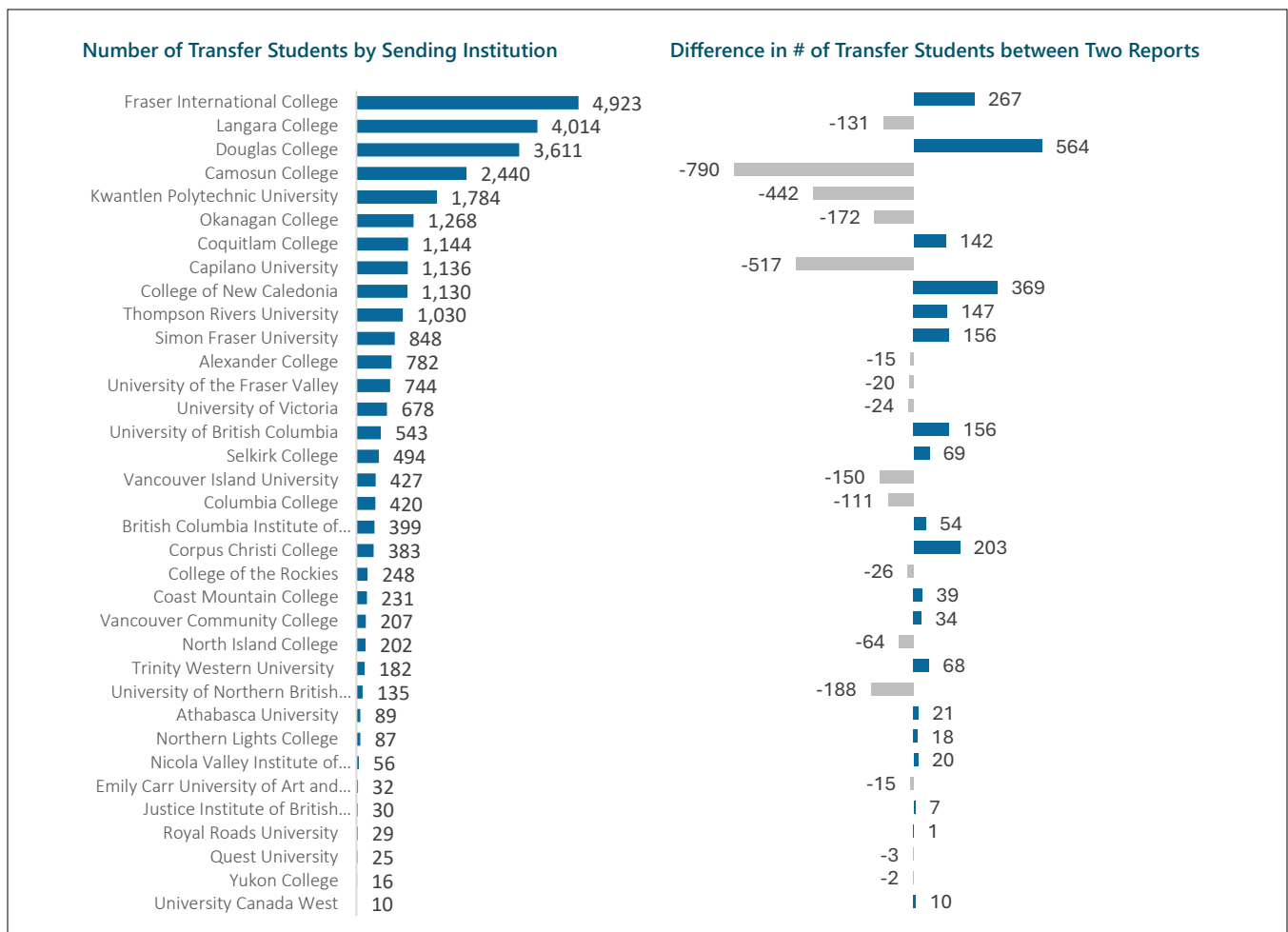
The sending institutions showing the largest increase in transfer students from the previous report included Douglas College (+564), College of New Caledonia (+369), and Fraser International College (+267) (Figure 2). The expanded scope of the current report has impacted the differences between Douglas College, Coquitlam College, and Corpus Christi College. For example, at Douglas College, a total of 652 students from CapU, KPU, and UFV were reported in the current study as being beyond the scope of 2020. Similarly, about 200 transfer students from Coquitlam College and over 40 additional transfer students from Corpus Christi College were reported by newly added receiving universities, mainly KPU (Table 3). There was a significant increase in College of New Caledonia transfer students at UNBC in the current study compared to UNBC 2020 numbers (597 to 1,001), possibly via increased opportunities in the transfer pathways between these two institutions.

Some sending institutions had a large decrease in the number of transfer students in the two reporting periods, e.g., Camosun College (-790), Capilano University (-517), and Kwantlen Polytechnic University (-442). The expanding options for students to complete their post-secondary journey without transfer (e.g., the growth of the number of baccalaureate programs in almost all BC public post-secondary institutions (Heslop, 2023) might have influenced these results.

UBC reported a significantly lower number of UNBC transfer students (from 220 in 2020 to 37 in the current study) (Table 3). The changes in UNBC students' mobility may have been affected by the development of new programs and pathways at UNBC and the favourable regional labour market, which may have attracted UNBC students, thus removing the need to transfer.

As in previous years, students from the Mainland/Southwest region's sending institutions constituted the majority (71%) of transfer students (Table 4). This percentage was up from 68% in the last reporting period, likely due to the addition of transfer students at three more receiving universities located in the Mainland/Southwest. A higher overall percentage (37% in the current study vs. 35% in 2020) transferred from private Mainland/Southwest institutions. However, in the current reporting period, the percentage declined for private Mainland/Southwest sending institutions from 41% in 2019/20 and 2021/22 to 30% in 2022/23 and proportionally increased for the public sending institutions in the same region (59% in 2019/20 and 2021/22 to 70% in 2022/23) (Table 4). The reasons for the decline in the transfer student numbers from private institutions are likely related to the difficulties faced by international students (e.g., at Fraser International College) in starting programs during the pandemic and transferring post-pandemic.

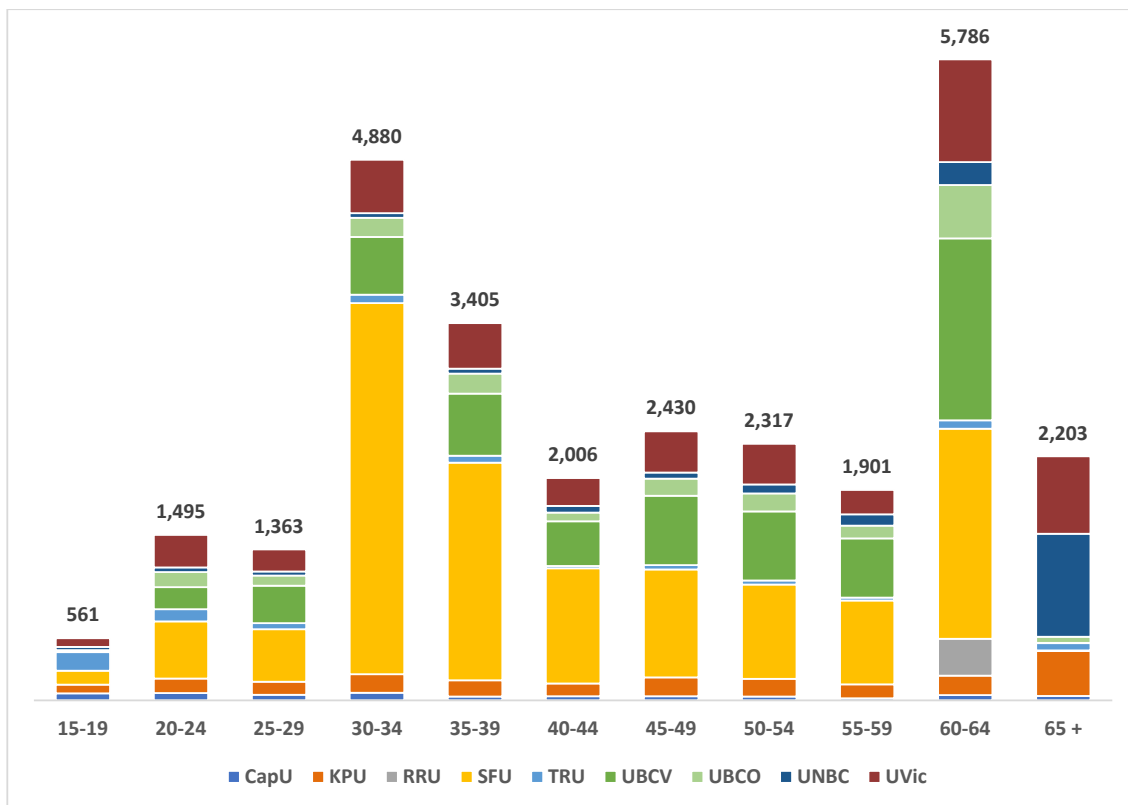

Continued with the pattern seen in the 2013/14 - 2017/18 reporting period, the two largest groups of transfer students were those at the start of second year (30-34 credits transferred at admission; 17% of transfer students) and at the start of the third year (60-64 credits transferred at admission; 20% of transfer students) of baccalaureate studies (Figure 3). Similar to the last reporting period across receiving institutions, the average number of transferred credits ranged from 36.5 at TRU to 60 at RRU, with an average of 46.4 transfer credits across all eight institutions (Tables 6 and 7).

The current study identified significantly larger percentages of students transferring 60-64 or 65+ credits at admissions as compared to percentages in the same categories in the 2020 report. The regions with the most pronounced increases in student numbers in the “65+” category was Cariboo/North (+22%) and Out-of-Province (+13%). The number of students transferring 65+ credits at admission almost doubled compared to 2020 - 2,203 students in the current study vs. 1,079 in the 2020 report (Table 5).

On the other hand, the percentage of students with 15-19 credits transferred at admissions decreased by 16 percentage points for the Out-of-Province region between the two reports, while all other regions did not have a change in the “15-19” category. There were overall more students with a larger number of credits transferred at admission in this study than in the 2020 report.

Figure 3: The number of BC transfer students by “Credits Transferred at Admission” category and by receiving institution



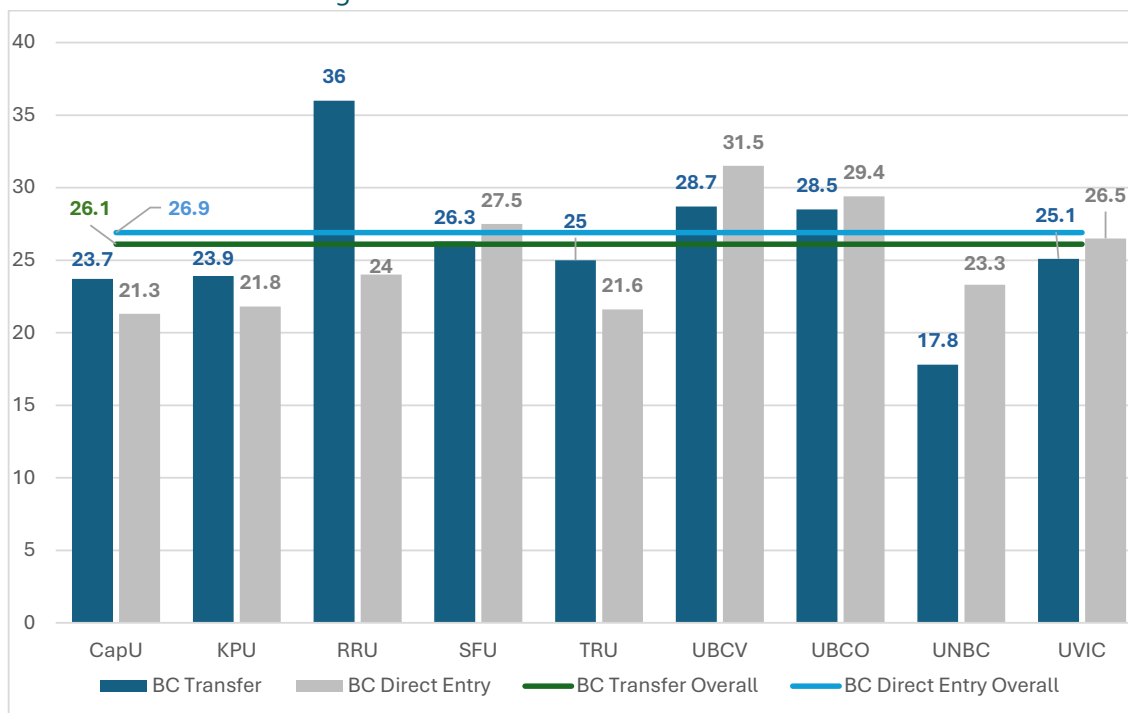
Credits Taken in First 12 Months of Enrolment at Receiving Institution

Excluding RRU, which has a different structure of programs than the other receiving universities, the number of credits taken in the first 12 months of enrollment at a receiving institution ranged from 17.8 to 28.5 credits for BC transfer students, and from 21.3 to 31.0 credits for BC direct entry students (Figure 4; Table 7). Overall, on average, direct-entry students take a slightly higher number of credits in their first 12 months at the university than transfer students (26.9 credits for direct-entry students vs. 26.1 credits for transfer students).

At CapU, KPU, RRU and TRU, transfer students took, on average, more credits than direct entry students in the first 12 months at a receiving institution. The receiving institution with the highest number of credits transfer students took in their first 12 months post-transfer was RRU with an average of 36 credits compared to the 24 credits taken by the direct entry students. However, this number at RRU is down from the average of 43.6 credits in the previous reporting period of 2013/14 to 2017/18 (Figure 4; detailed data by sending institution in Table 8).

On the other hand, the average number of credits taken by the direct entry students at SFU, UBC (both UBCV and UBCO), and UVic is higher than of those of the transfer credit students. The BC transfer credit students took, on average, 5.5 credits fewer than the BC direct entry students at UNBC (Figure 4), a sharp drop from the previous reporting period (24.7 credits in 2020 to 17.8 credits in this study). The change in the student demographics and the structure of the UNBC programs likely may have caused the difference.

Figure 4: Average number of credits taken by BC transfer and BC direct entry students in the first 12 months at a receiving institution



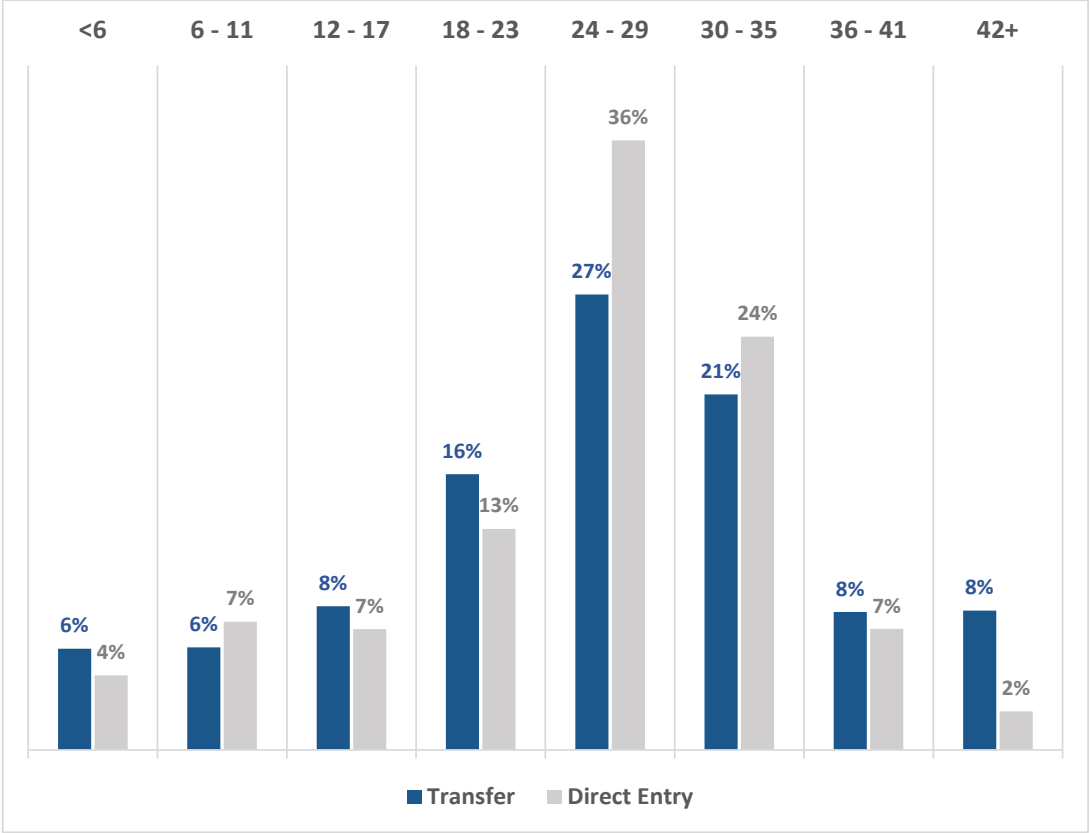

Like in the previous reporting period, a higher proportion of transfer students took 23 credits or fewer (the divider which can be a proxy for part-time status) during their first 12 months at the receiving institution (36% of all transfer students) than a corresponding proportion of direct entry students (31% of all direct entry students). Compared to the 2020 results, the gap got smaller between the average number of credits taken in the first 12 months for transfer and direct entry students: in 2020, 32% of transfer students and only 19% of direct entry students took 23 or fewer credits.

More direct-entry students took 24-29 and 30-35 credits in their first 12 months: 60% were in these two categories versus 48% of transfer students ([Figure 5](#)).

The distribution of the number of credits taken in the first 12 months varied across receiving universities. Transfer students most commonly took between 24 and 35 credits at the majority of receiving institutions, with the exceptions of RRU (40% of transfer students took 42+ credits) and UNBC (31% of transfer students took fewer than six credits) ([Table 9](#)). These exceptions highlighted the likely difference in the structure of the transfer pathways for RRU and UNBC from the other receiving universities.

Figure 5: The distribution (percent) of BC transfer and BC direct entry students by number of credits taken in the first 12 months after admission to a receiving institution



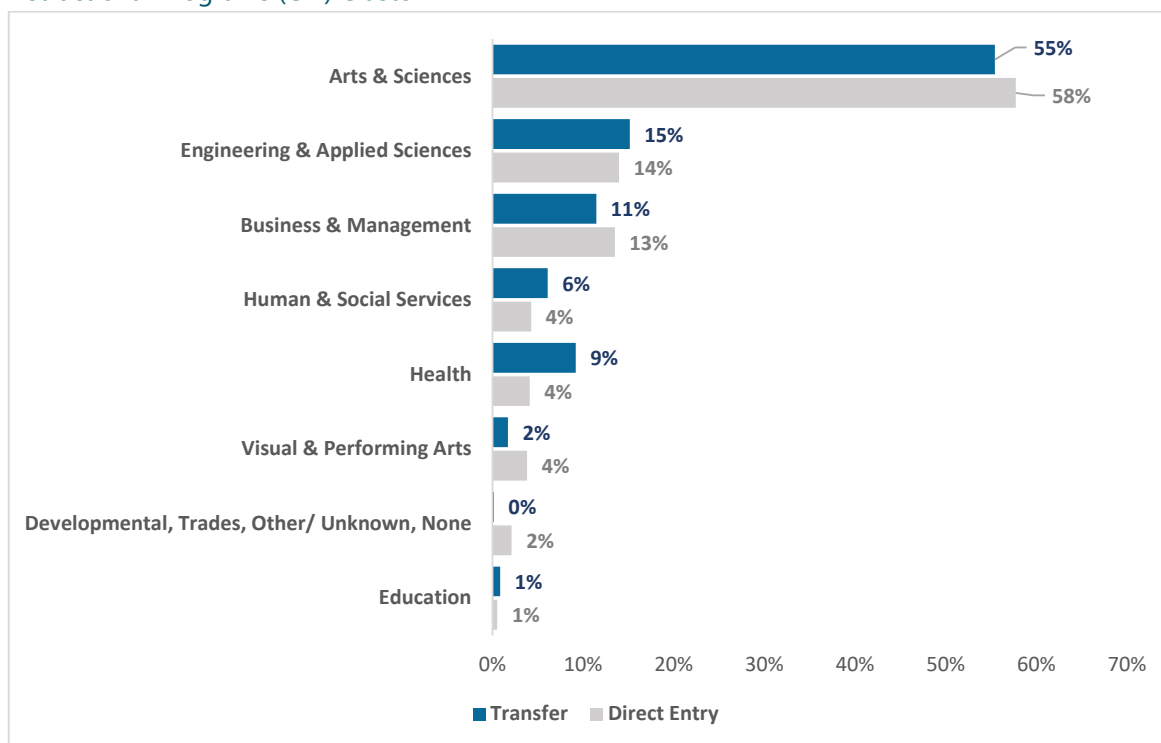
Academic Program

The Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) categorization system was used to group students into the academic programs they were enrolled in and compare data across institutions (Statistics Canada, 2016). As before, over half of the students (55% of transfer students and 58% of direct entry students) were enrolled in Arts and Sciences ([Figure 6](#); detailed data by sending institution in [Table 10](#)). The following largest categories were the Engineering and Applied Sciences program (15% of transfer students and 14% of direct entry students) and the Business & Management program (11% of transfer students and 13% of direct entry students.) ([Figure 6](#)).

The percentages of transfer students in Engineering and Applied Science programs (15% of all transfer students), Health (9%), and Human and Social Services (6%) were higher than corresponding percentages of direct entry students (Engineering and Applied Sciences 14% of all direct entry students, Health 4%, and Human and Social Services 4%).

Where available, specific numbers and percentages of transfer and direct entry students by faculty/school at the receiving universities are shown in [Tables 11-19](#) and [10-18](#).

International and Indigenous Status

As in the previous report, the proportions of students self-identifying as Indigenous were similar among transfer and direct entry students, at 3% ([Table 20](#); [Table 22](#) contains detailed data by sending institution). The percentage of transfer students decreased by one percentage, while that for direct entry students remains the same compared to five years ago (4% of transfer students and 3% of direct entry students were reported as Indigenous in 2017/2018).

By national status, 9% of direct entry students and 31% of transfer students were international students ([Table 21](#); [Table 23](#) contains detailed data by sending institution). Both percentages were up from 4.4% and 27.1%, respectively, in the previous reporting period. Private sending institutions, such as Fraser International College, had a much higher percentage of international students than public sending institutions.

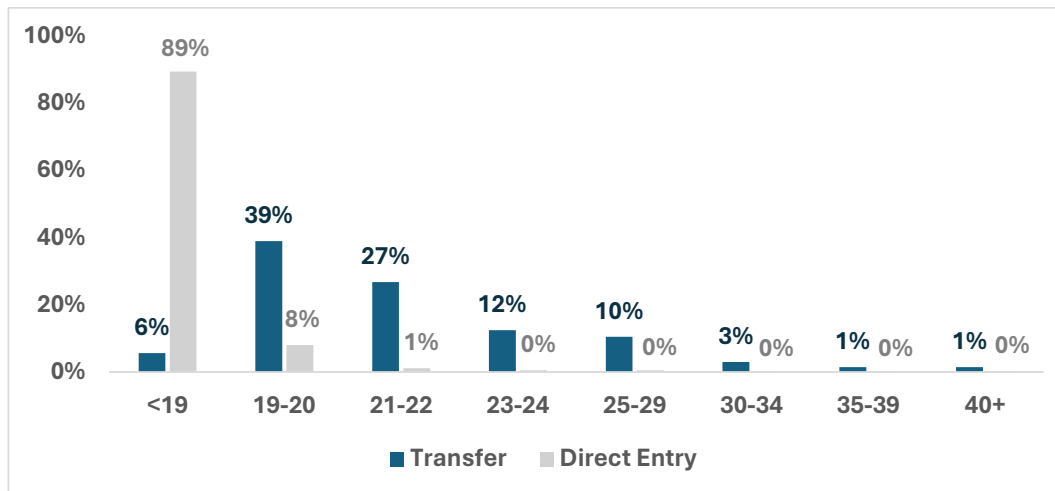
Age

Transfer students were older than their direct entry counterparts, with an average age of 22.2, compared to 18.1 for direct entry students ([Table 24](#); the table contains detailed data by sending institution). While direct entry students are a majority in the <19 age group (89%), transfer students are in the majority for students older than 19 ([Figure 7](#)).

The average age of the transfer students was lower in this reporting period than in the last reporting period (22.2 in the current study vs. 24.2 in 2020). There was also a much wider distribution of age groups among transfer students than direct entry students ([Figure 7](#)).

In general, transfer students from private institutions in the Mainland/Southwest region had the youngest average age among transfer students from all regions ([Table 24](#)), likely due to the large percentage of students from younger age groups in Fraser International College. While BC transfer students admitted to SFU, TRU, UBCV, UBCO, and UVIC were, on average, in their early twenties, transfer students admitted to RRU and UNBC are, on average, in their late twenties. RRU transfer students' average age was 27 years, and UNBC transfer students' average age was 26 years ([Table 25](#)).

Gender

In this reporting period, 54% of transfer students and 56% of direct entry students identified as female ([Tables 26-27](#)). This is down slightly from 55% and 57%, respectively, from the previous reporting period. The percentage of females ranged from 50% (SFU) to 78% (UNBC) ([Table 26](#)). The range of academic programs and disciplines, and their regional relevance are likely prominent factors that affect the percentage of females by sending and receiving institutions.

The category "Other" was included in the reporting for the first time. Around 1% of transfer students was in this category, a similar percentage to the direct entry students ([Table 27](#)).

PERFORMANCE

GPA Trends

The comparison of average admission GPA (where available) for transfer students between 2013/14 – 2017/18 and 2018/19 – 2022/23 reports points to a very small increase for several receiving institutions. The change in average graduation GPA between the two reporting periods is small. The comparison was not possible for other receiving institutions due to the lack of historical data ([Table 1](#)).

For the current reporting period, BC transfer students had higher admission average GPAs than those of BC direct entry students at UVIC (5.8 versus 5.3). Otherwise, direct entry students had a higher GPA at other reporting receiving institutions ([Table 28](#)). It should be noted that transfer students' admission GPA was post-secondary GPA, while direct entry students' GPA was high school GPA.

After completion of 15 credits at the receiving institutions, BC transfer students had higher average GPA than those of BC direct entry students at all receiving institutions ([Table 29](#)). This is consistent with the findings in the 2020 report. The higher GPA at 15 credits (i.e., a proxy for about one semester of full-time studies) may imply lower "transfer shock" for BC transfer students, and higher "entry shock" for BC direct entry students.

At graduation, similar to the previous reporting period, BC transfer students had higher average GPAs than BC direct entry students at RRU (3.7 versus 3.4). At the other institutions the difference in GPA was comparable ([Table 30](#)).

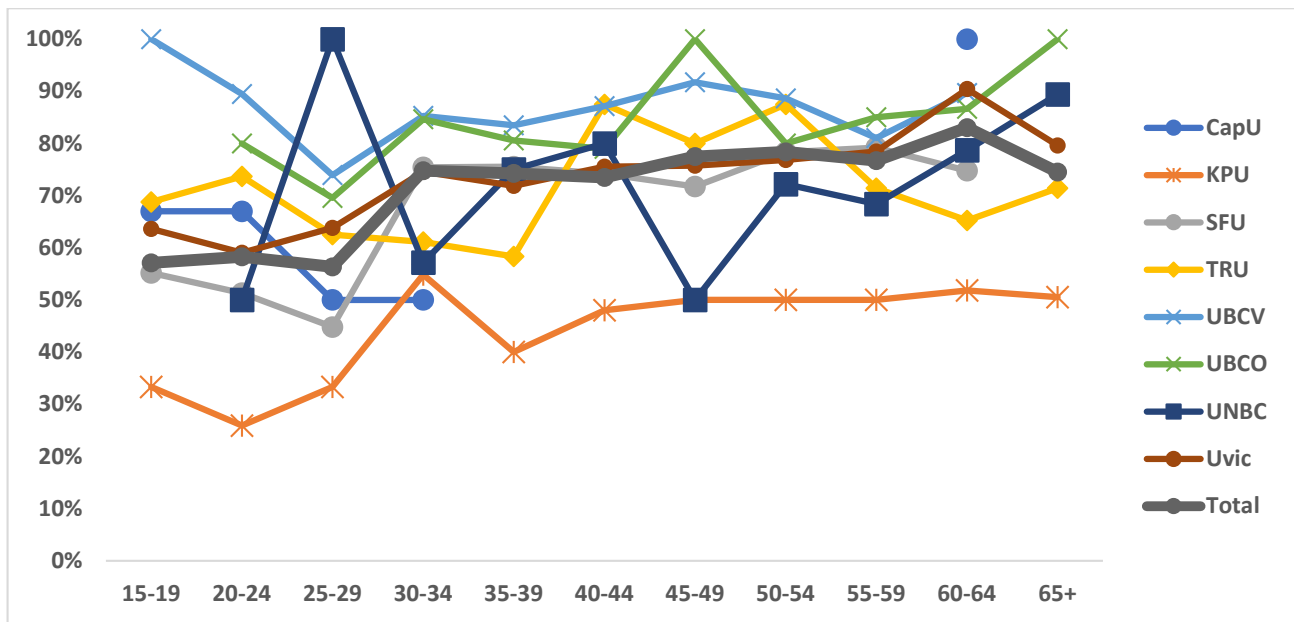
[Tables 28-30](#) show the GPAs by sending institution at admission, at 15 credits after starting at a receiving institution, and at graduation. [Figures 19-26](#) present trends of GPA at two or three points in time for each receiving university (where data were available) by region of transfer students and compare these trends with the direct entry students' GPA.

Degree Completion Rates

Degree completion rates were assessed for transfer students admitted in 2018/19 academic year who graduated from the receiving institution by the end of the 2022/23 academic year. This cohort was selected to allow transfer students to complete a baccalaureate degree at receiving institutions, assuming typical transfer to Year 2 or Year 3 of the program. For comparison, an earlier cohort (2016/17) of direct entry students was selected to "match" the possible time students stay at a receiving university. 75% of BC transfer students in the selected cohort completed a degree, compared to 67% for BC direct entry students ([Table 31](#)). This percentage was slightly higher than the previous reporting period (72% of transfer students and 60% of direct entry students in the 2020 report).

Unlike the 2015 and 2020 reports that uncovered a stronger relationship between a more significant number of transferred credits translated into a greater likelihood of students graduating within the study time frame, there was a considerable variation among the results by the university in the current study. While a general trend for a higher likelihood to graduate with more transferred credits was generally more pronounced for SFU, UBC and UVic, the data do not allow such a conclusion for the other receiving universities ([Figure 8](#)). There were factors at play beyond the number of credits that impacted the degree completion rate; the difference in transfer pathways during and after the pandemic may be one of them.

Among regions of sending institutions, Thompson-Okanagan-Kootenay had the highest degree completion rate (80%), and Out-of-Province had the lowest (61%). [Table 31](#) contains detailed data on graduation rates for transfer and direct entry students by sending and receiving institutions.

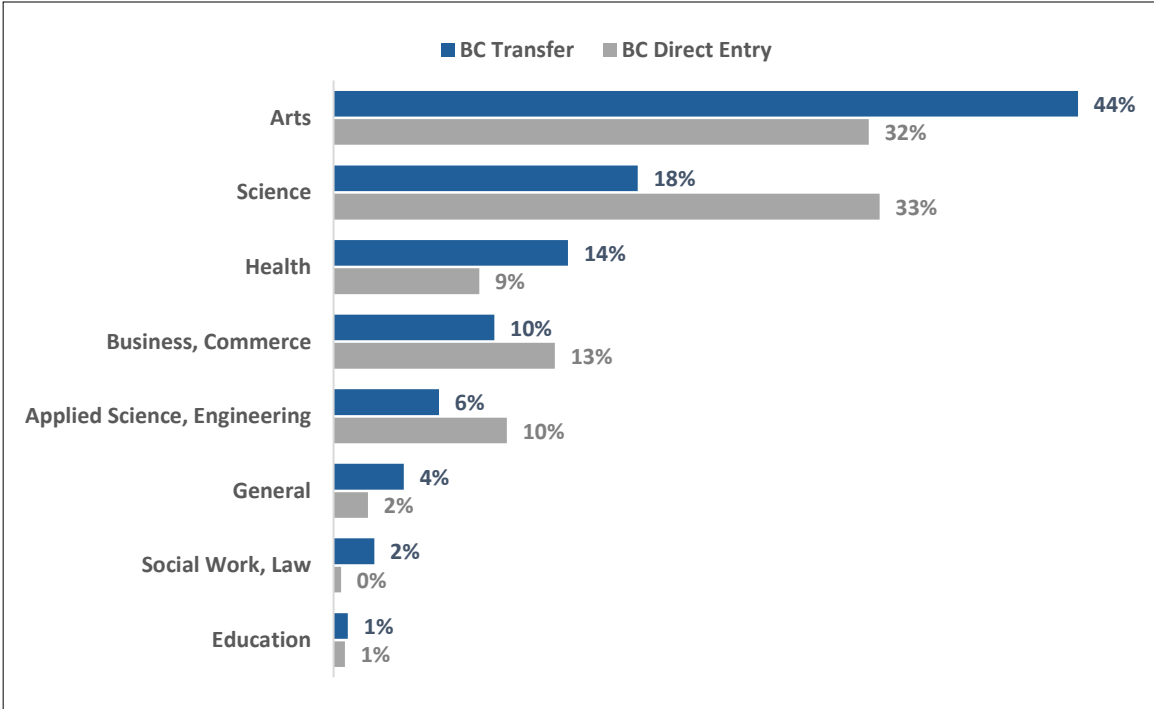
Credentials Completed

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Sciences were the most common credentials for BC transfer students who got admitted in the 2018/19 academic year and who graduated before the end of the reporting period.

A higher percentage of transfer graduates completed a Bachelor of Arts degree than direct entry graduates (44% of transfer students vs. 32% of direct entry students) ([Figure 9](#)). A Bachelor of Science degree was, in contrast, the program of choice for more direct entry students than for transfer students: 18% of transfer students and 33% graduated with it ([Table 32](#); [Figure 9](#)). Compared to the direct entry students, smaller percentages of transfer students graduated with Business/Commerce credentials (10% of transfer graduates vs. 13% of direct entry graduates) and Applied Science/Engineering (6% of transfer graduates vs. 10% of direct entry graduates). On the other hand, higher percentages of BC transfer students completed credentials in Health (14% of transfer graduates) and Social Work/Law (2% of transfer graduates) programs than BC direct entry students in the same programs (9% and less than 1%, respectively). These results are comparable to those in the previous reporting period.

The full list of completed credentials by receiving institution can be found in [Tables 35-42](#). The number of months and the number of credits to obtain a specific credential are also included.

Time and Credits to Complete Credential

BC transfer students took an average of 37.6 months at the receiving institution to complete a credential. This period is understandably shorter than the same metric for BC direct entry students (53.0 months), given transfer students often spend up to 24 months at their sending institutions before their transfer ([Table 33](#)). The period for BC transfer students they were ranged from 21.5 months at CapU to 43.5 months at SFU. This difference may be explained by a higher proportion of shorter credentials (such as diplomas and certificates) at CapU, KPU and TRU. In contrast, all SFU and UBCV and UBCO transfer and direct entry graduates completed baccalaureate degrees, which usually take longer to complete.

When the number of credits was controlled as a variable in the analysis (i.e., the number of months to graduation after 60 credits had been completed), both groups completed a credential within the same amount of time: about 29 months (29.6 months for BC transfer students and 29.2 months for BC direct entry students) ([Table 34](#)). Even for BC transfer students graduating with a baccalaureate (as opposed to all credentials), this period was roughly the same – 30.3 months to graduate from 60 credits. This period could roughly equal to about two and a half years of full-time study. This contrasts a 9-month difference to graduate between the BC transfer and BC direct entry students found in the previous reporting period.

Course Performance

The course grades confirm that transfer students' performance was often similar to that of direct entry students. However, the BC transfer students' admissions GPAs was typically lower than the admissions GPAs of BC direct entry students. The receiving institutions included courses at the second- and third-year level that are typically required for programs and have a high enrolment of transfer students ([Tables 43-49](#)). The lists contain course titles and GPAs for direct entry and transfer students.

The detailed data on the number of BC transfer students by sending institution, their admission GPA, and their grades in specific courses can be found in separate appendices for each receiving institution ([Appendices B-G](#)), where such data were available. These appendices also contain information on the number of students, admission GPA and course performance in the selected courses for BC direct entry students.

CONCLUSION

Despite demographic differences, BC transfer students' performance was comparable with that of BC direct entry students. After a drop in performance from admissions GPA during the first few months at a new institution, the GPA for both groups generally increased by the time of graduation.

Of BC transfer students admitted at receiving institutions in 2018/19, 75% graduated with a baccalaureate by or in 2022/23—the degree completion rates varied by sending and receiving institution, as well as by region. The overall average for graduating with a baccalaureate degree for both BC direct entry and BC transfer students was about 29-30 months (2.5 years of full-time study) after the students collected 60 credits. Baccalaureate degrees most commonly received by BC transfer students were in Arts, Science, and Health. The comparison of GPA in common second- and third-year level courses also confirmed that BC transfer students performed well in those courses post-transfer.

General Notes for the Tables:

A cell is considered sensitive if the corresponding row or column total is smaller than 10. The cell is marked with "X." If the corresponding row or column total is greater than or equal to 10, nothing will be done to the cell. If a row or column total is less than 10, it is masked as "<10". Totals in rows and columns with masked cells and another cell in the same row and column are rounded to the nearest five and marked with an asterisk. The subtotal or total will not be rounded if a column or row contains multiple masked cells. These edits are for the protection of the privacy of the students involved.

An average and a percentage are considered sensitive if the denominator used to calculate it is less than 10. In this situation, the cell is marked with "X." For row or column total or subtotal cells, if the count of the denominator used to calculate the average is less than 10, the percentage for the cell will be replaced with "<10". If a row or column has one masked cell, randomly choose another cell, round the percentage in that cell up to the nearest 0.1 and mark it with an asterisk. For rows or columns with multiple masked cells, nothing will be done to the individual subtotal or individual cells. These edits are for the protection of the privacy of the students involved.

Figure 10: CapU percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

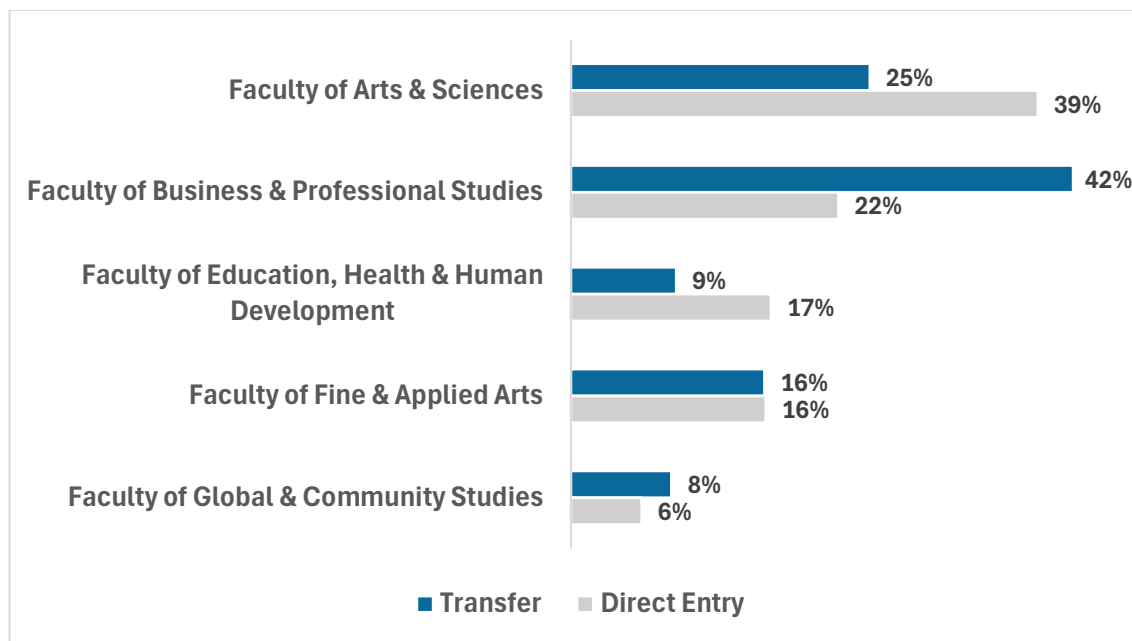

Figure 11: KPU percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

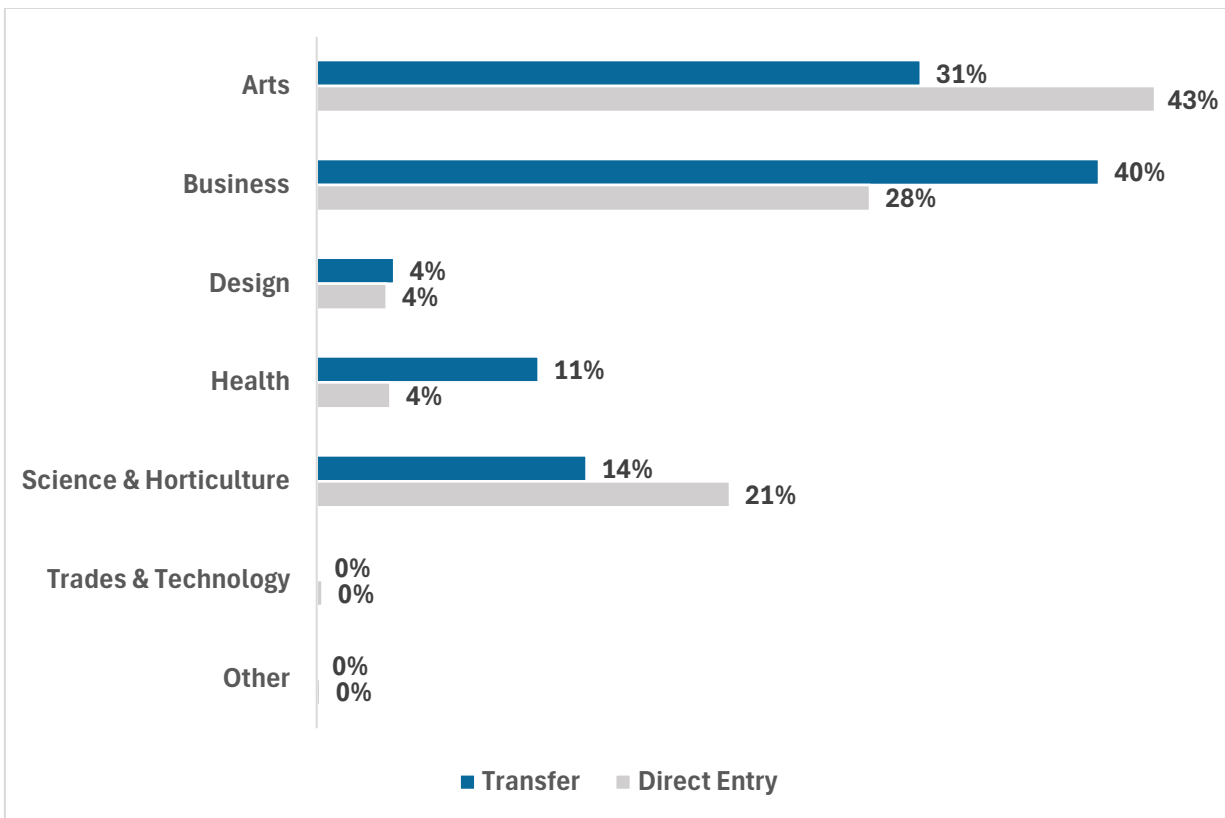

Figure 12: RRU percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

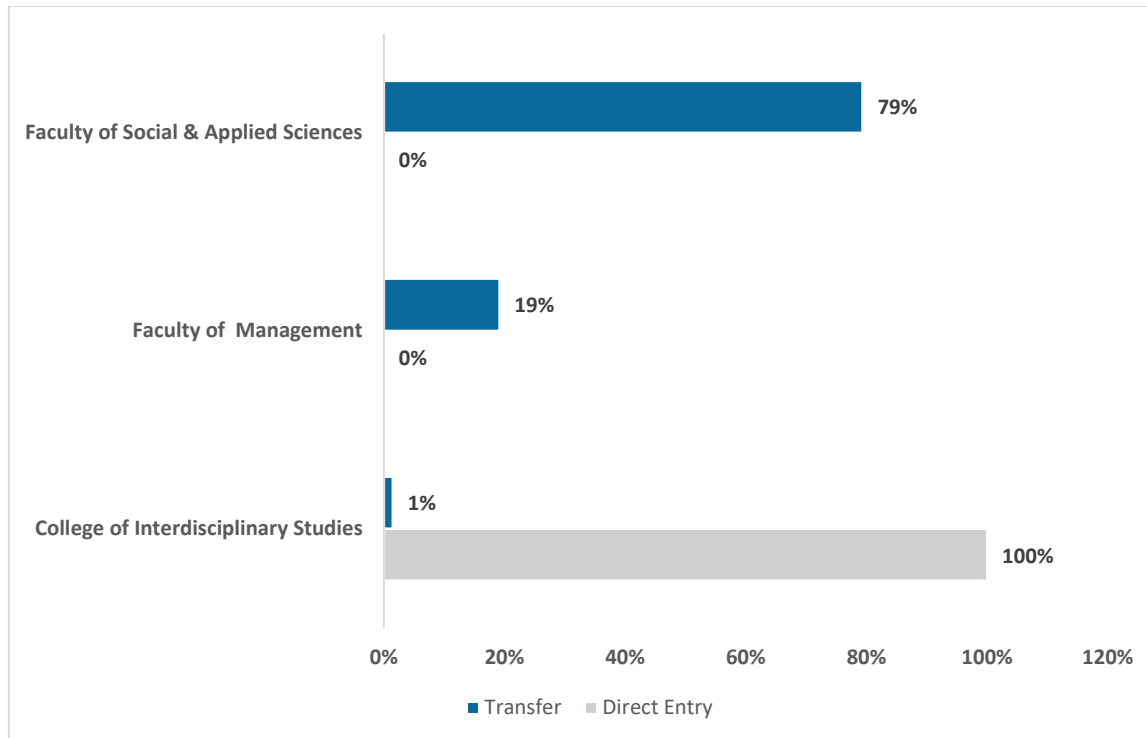

Figure 13: SFU percent distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

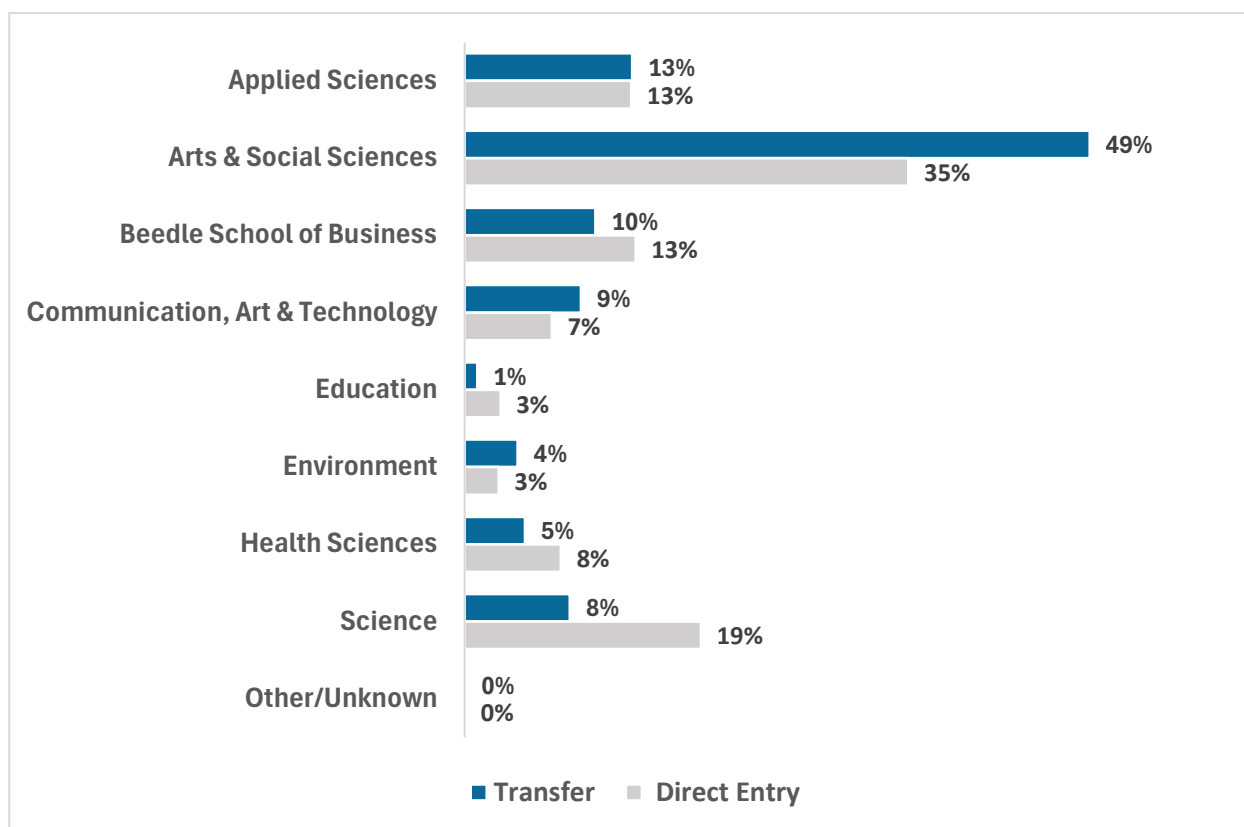

Figure 14: TRU percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

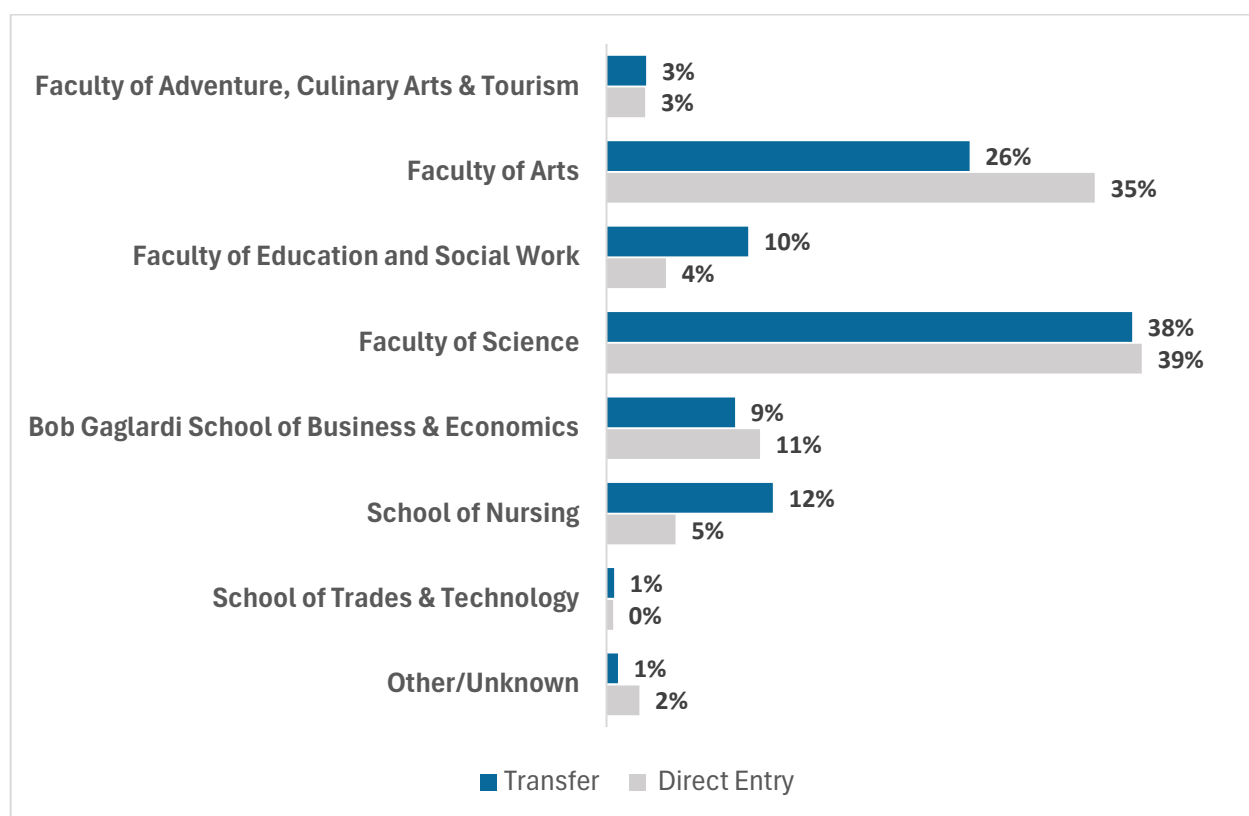

Figure 15: UBCV percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

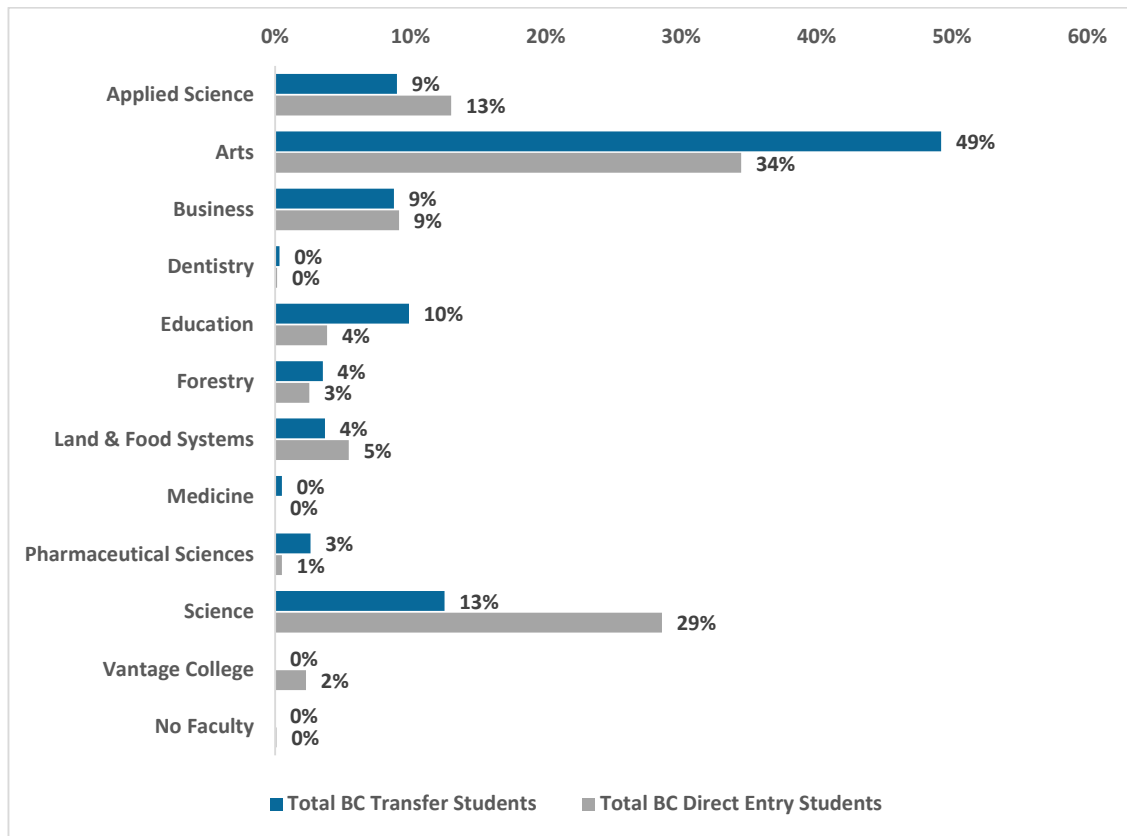

Figure 16: UBCO percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

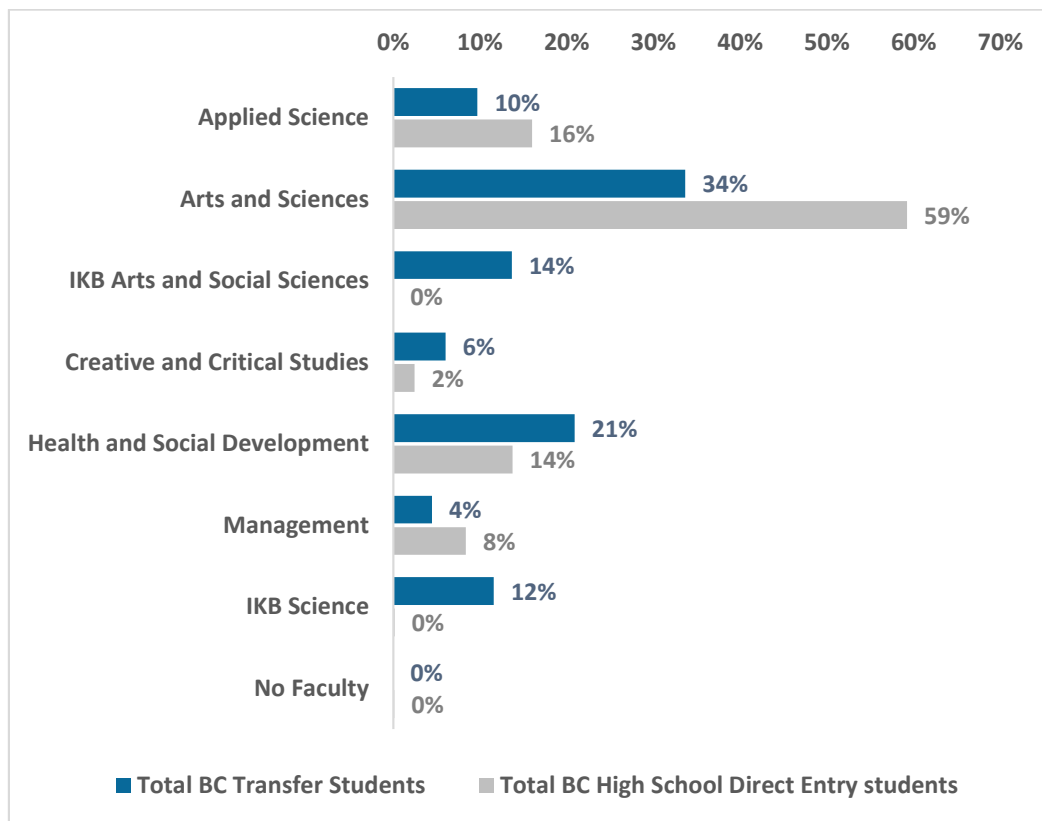

Figure 17: UNBC percentage distribution of transfer and direct entry students by faculty

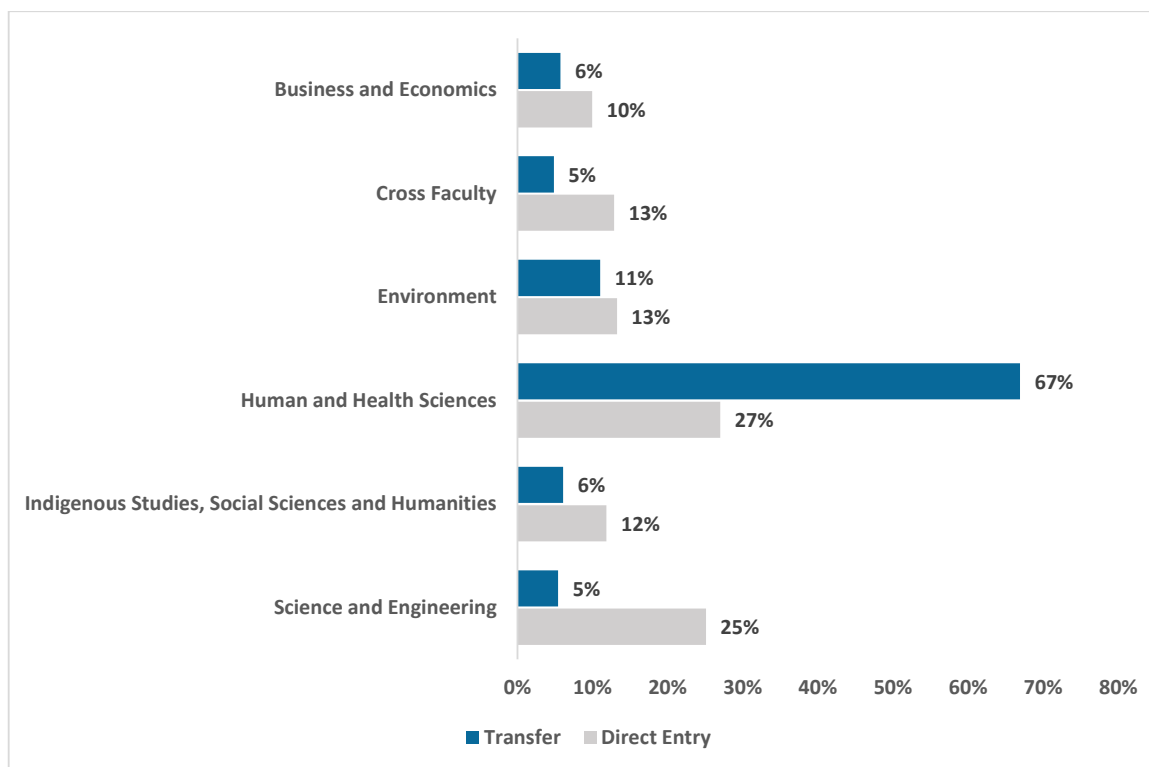
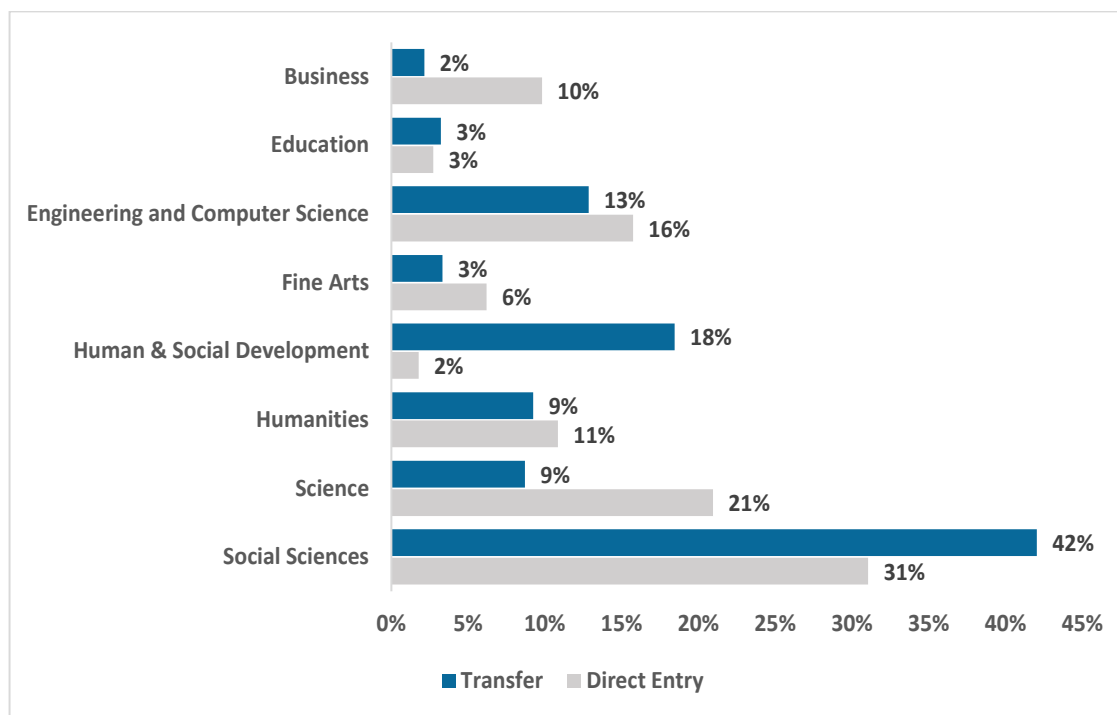

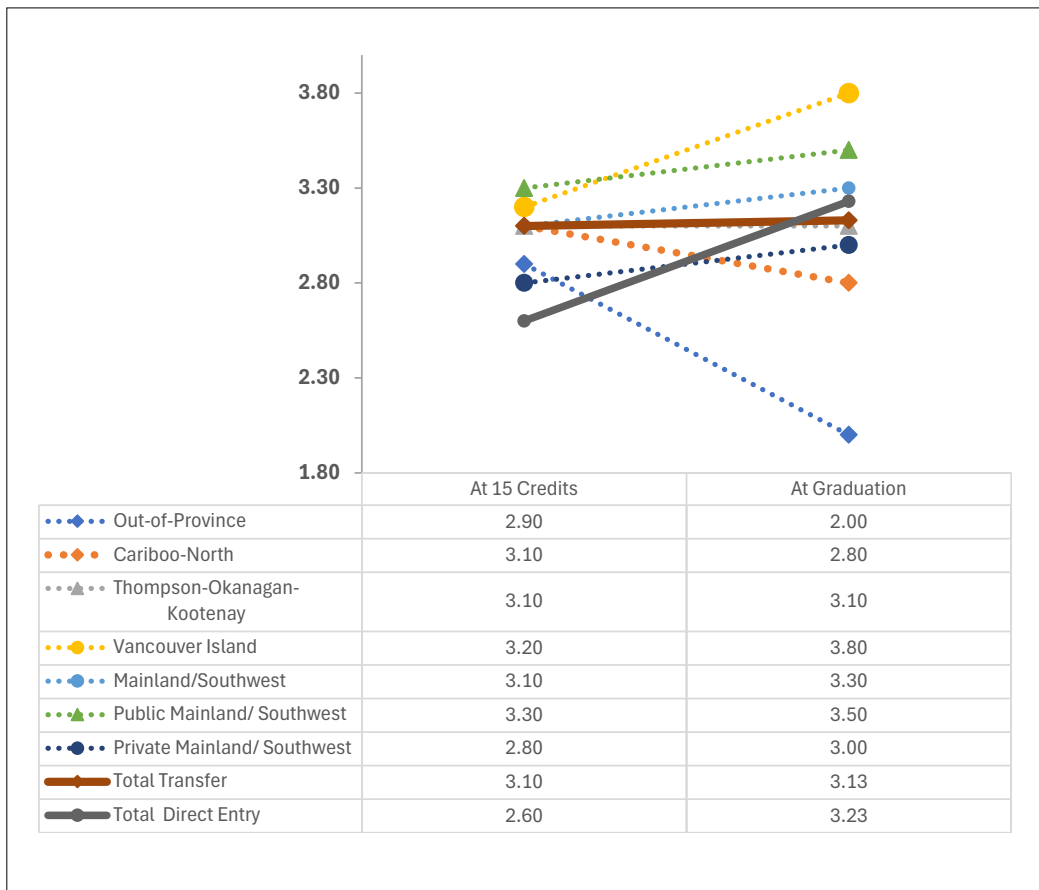

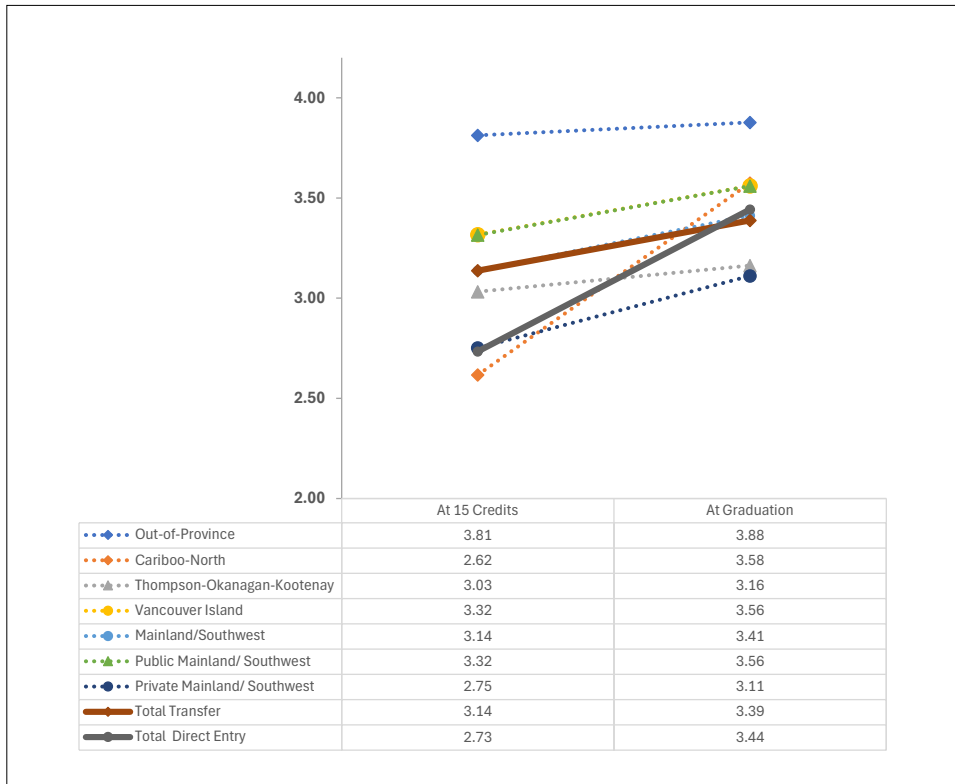

Figure 19: CapU comparison of GPA at two points in time



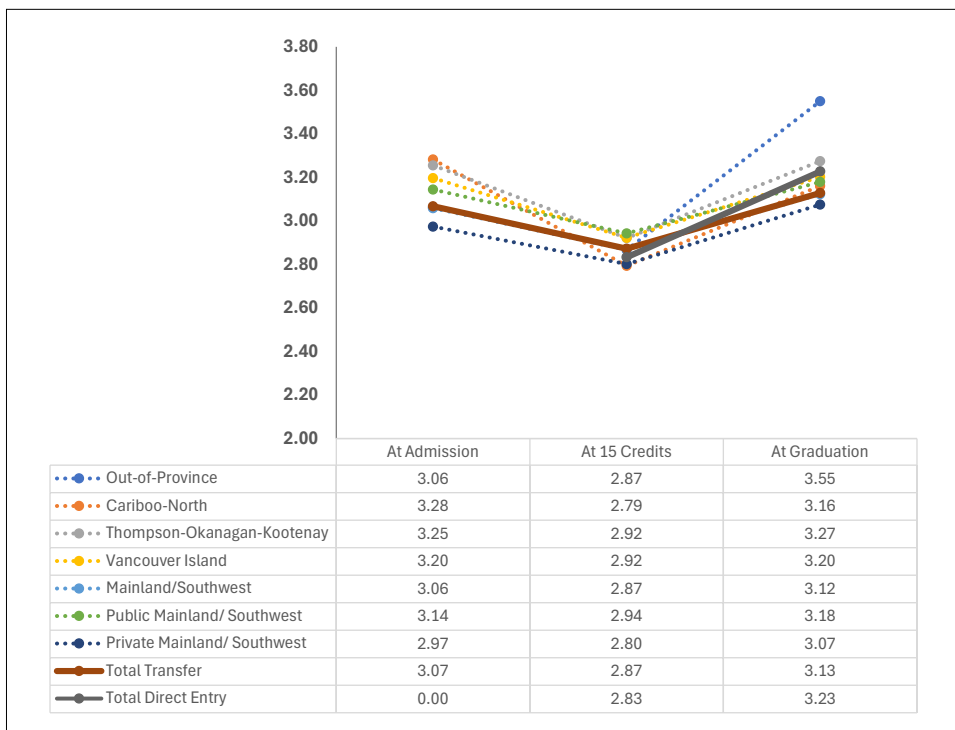

Figure 20: KPU comparison of GPA at two points in time



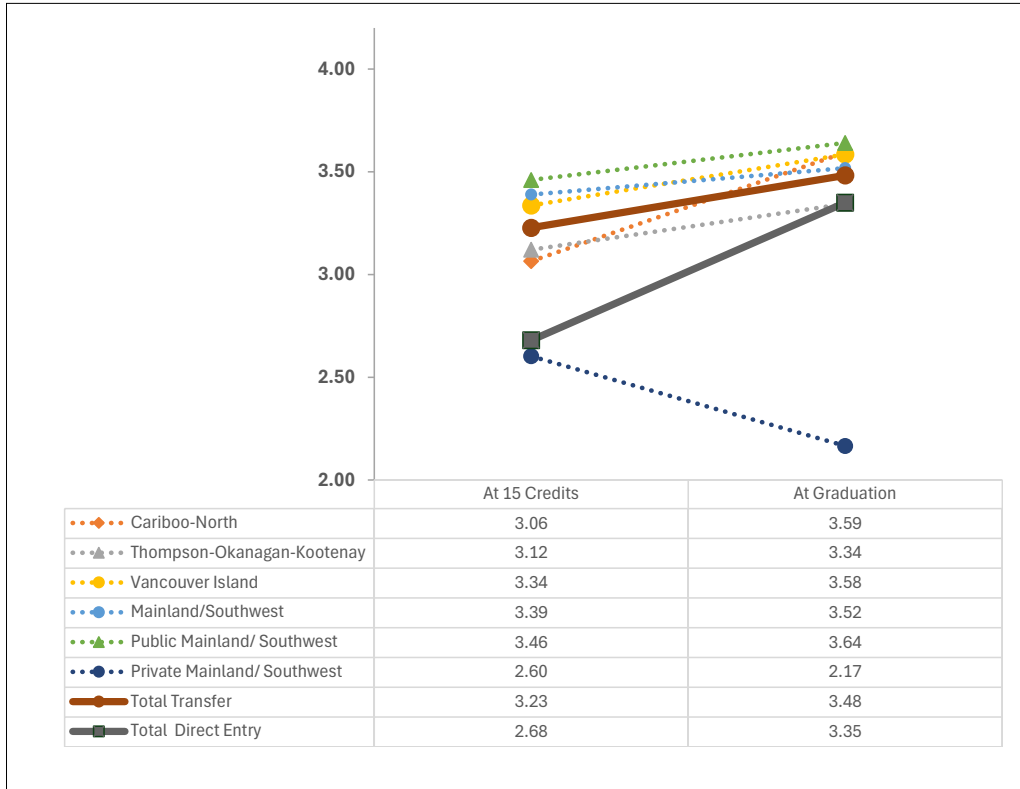

Figure 21: SFU comparison of GPA at three points in time



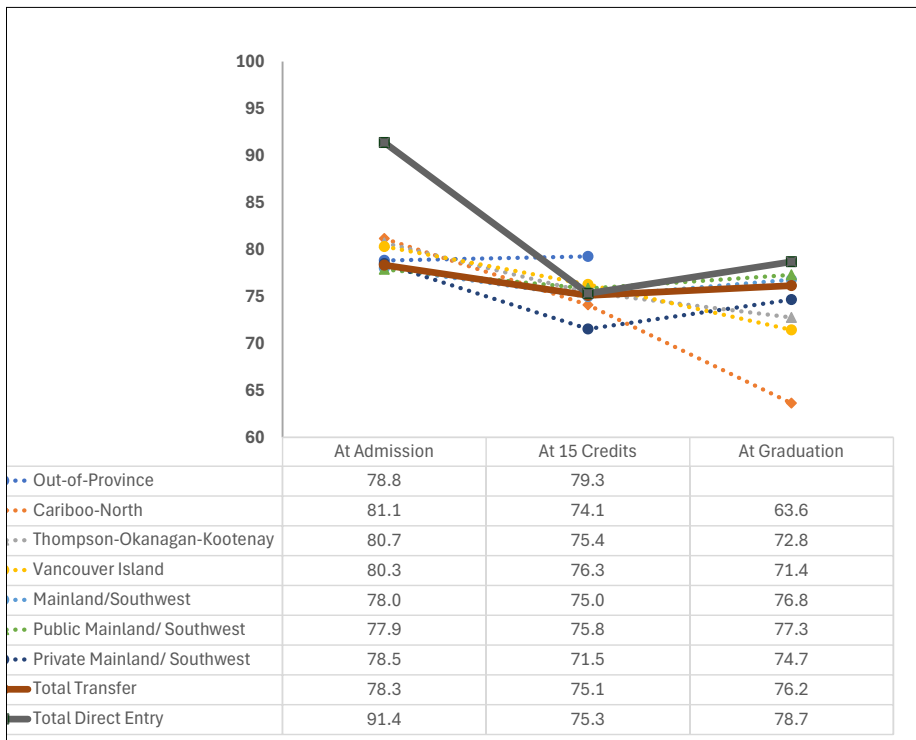

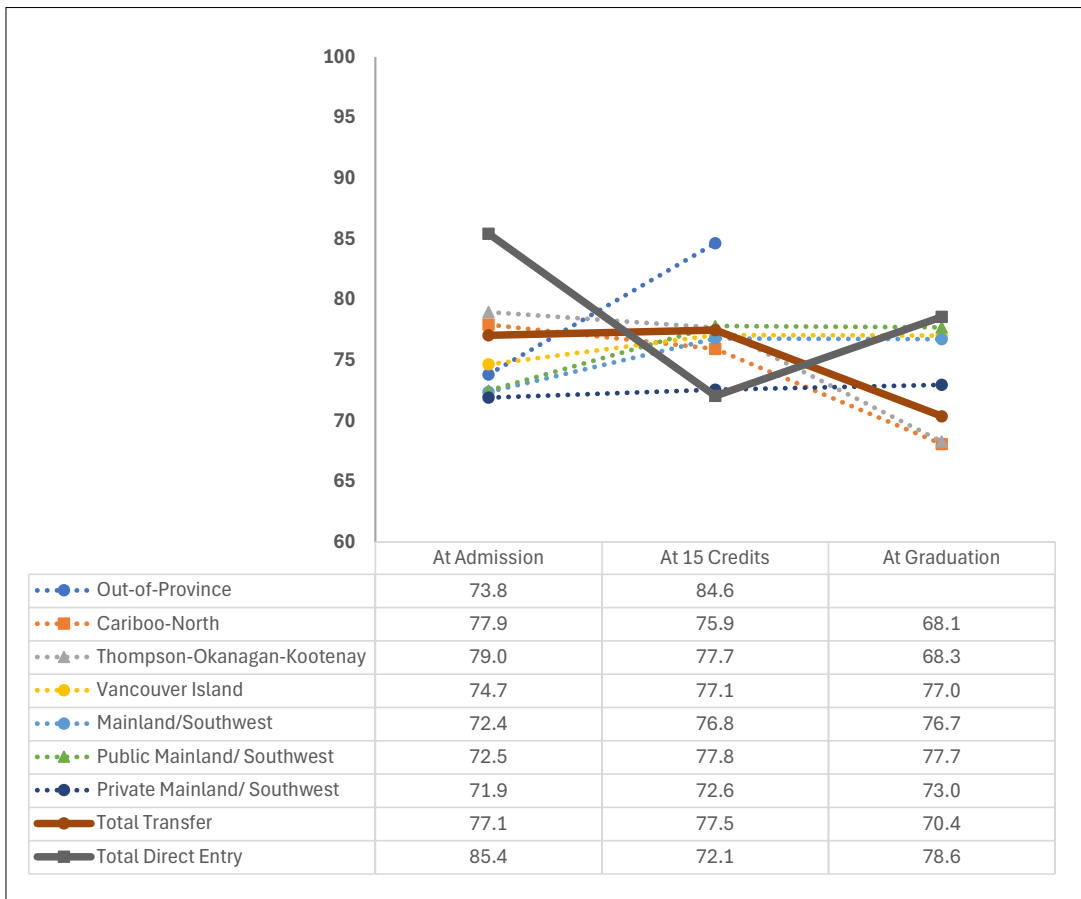
Figure 23: UBCV comparison of GPA at three points in time

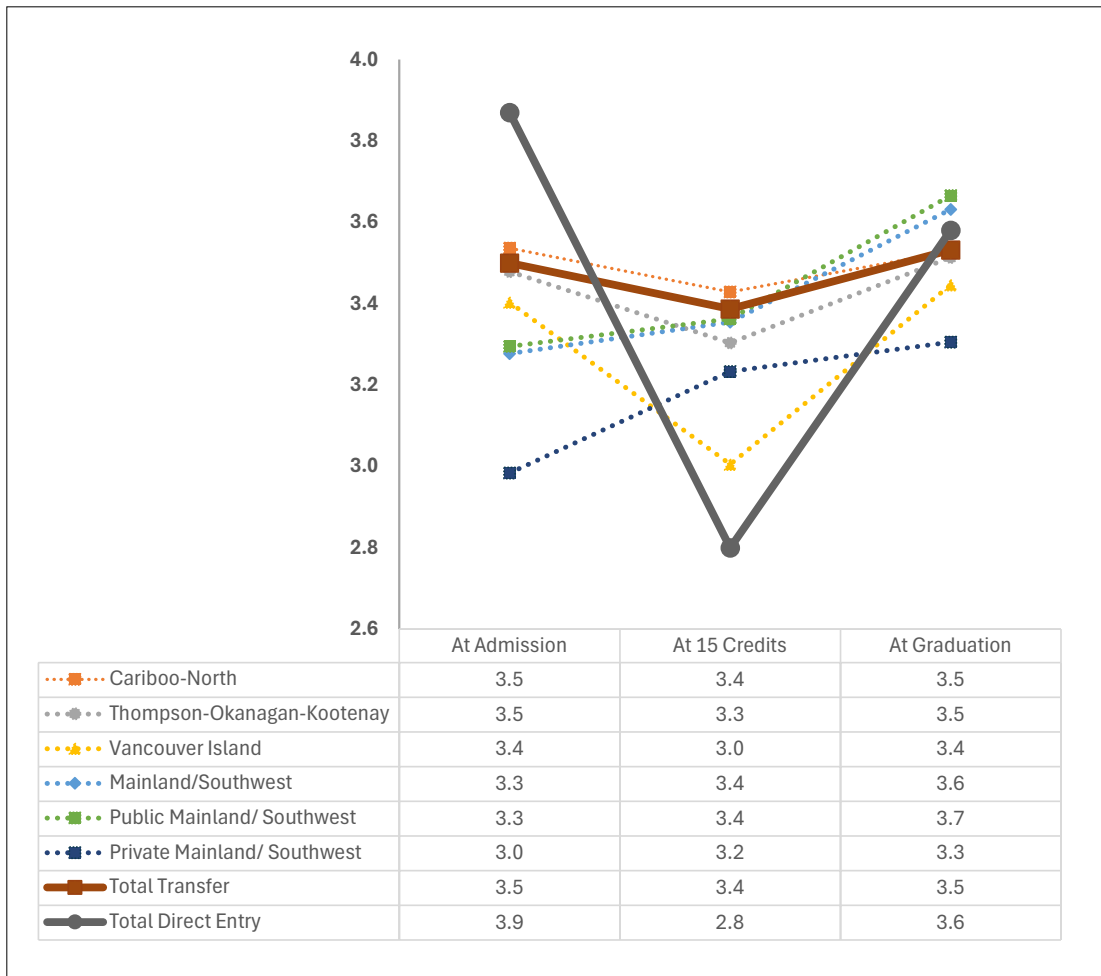
Figure 24: UBCO comparison of GPA at three points in time

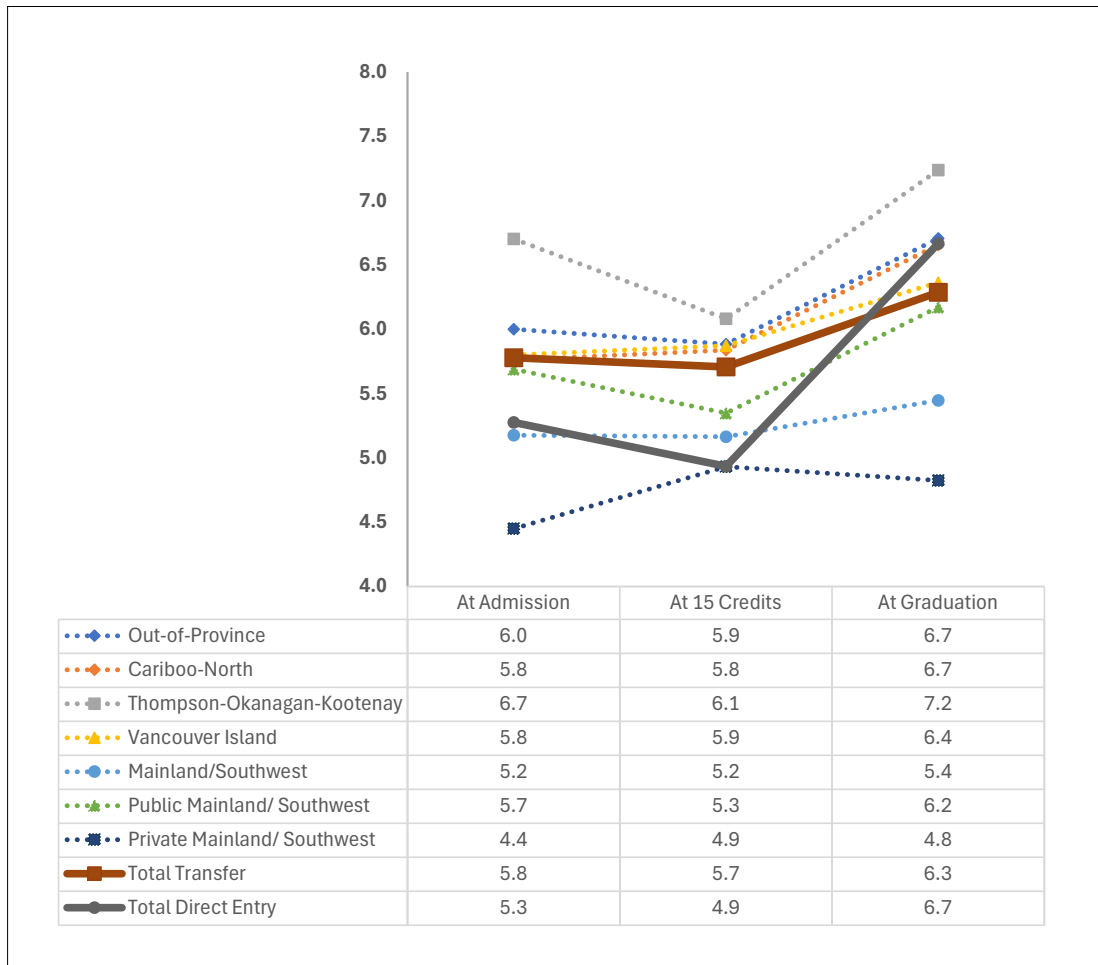
Figure 25: UNBC comparison of GPA at three points in time

APPENDIX A.

Background and Methodology

To support its mandate to facilitate admission, articulation, and transfer arrangements among BC Transfer System member institutions, the BC Council on Admissions and Transfer (BCCAT) has produced transfer students' Profile and Performance reports since the early 1990s that compare the demographics and the performance of transfer and direct entry students at research universities in British Columbia. As part of its 2023 research plan, BCCAT has commissioned a research team at Langara College to collect, analyze, and report, for the period of 2018/19 to 2022/23, on transfer students' profile and performance at all BC public universities that were able to participate. Understanding transfer students' performance within the BC system is a cornerstone of the Council's work on the development and maintenance of BC's Transfer System. Extending the existing work on research universities to all public universities expands that understanding.

This project can identify roadblocks, risks, and opportunities on pathways taken by the transfer students as well as the issues in equity of education pathways. These practices can then become policies regarding the transferability of courses and programs. As previous BC Transfer Student Profile reports, this report aims at analyzing the demographic characteristics and academic performance of students transferring to research-intensive universities in BC between 2018/19 and 2022/23. Other transfer pathways were not considered.

Methods

This report follows closely the format of BCCAT's 2020 report and uses the same method of data collection (Tikina, 2015, Plaid Consulting, 2020). All institutions provided data in the same format as supplied by the project team. The use of a common data submissions format helped to ensure that data were comparable across participating institutions. Consistent with the methodology developed by Tikina (2015) and used in Plaid Consulting (2020), this report defines the sending institution as the last institution that the student transferred from. The current report captures transfer students from all BC Transfer System (BCTS) member institutions that students transfer from and includes data from the majority of public universities in BC. Data from CapU, KPU and UFV were included to reflect the current transfer climate where all BC public universities receive transfer students.

All receiving universities, except KPU and UFV, provided their data in aggregate format based on the data template supplied by the research team. KPU and UFV data were provided at the case level and were aggregated for the analysis by the researchers. With the addition of the teaching-intensive universities, results are only comparable with the previous reports for the research-intensive universities. However, given the consistent format used in the reports, the comparison could be meaningful keeping in mind the potential impact of the additions.

As in the 2020 report, sending institutions are grouped into regions as shown in **Table A1**.

Consistent with previous studies, in the tables and charts, Total Transfer is defined as the number of students who entered an institution through transfer. On the other hand, Total Direct Entry is defined as the number of students who entered an institution directly after completing high school.

As a standard, categories with small numbers of transferring students are masked to protect individual students' privacy. A row or column is considered to contain confidential information if the total of its cells is smaller than 10. In this case, totals and subtotals for rows and columns with masked cells as well as randomly selected cells in same rows and columns are rounded to the nearest 5 and marked by an asterisk (for tables that show percentages, rounding is to the nearest 5 percentage points; for tables showing averages such as credits, rounding is to the nearest 0.1). For performance data, cells with fewer than 10 students are masked. For course-specific data in the Appendices, cells with GPAs for fewer than 5 students are suppressed.
