Academic Dual Credit (ADC) Students:



- tend to take ADC courses in Grades 11 and 12
- are predominantly female
- tend to have a high GPA in English 12
- are typically high academic performers overall.

The GPAs of ADC students are typically higher in Term 1, Year 1, and Year 2; but gender, English 12 GPA, and national status (domestic vs. international) are better indicators for post-secondary performance.

Dual credit in BC occurs when credit is granted at both a secondary school and post-secondary institution for completion of a course.

ADC Students' Transition to BC Public Post-Secondary Education





Most common disciplines of completed credentials:













22% Completed 1 or more post-secondary credentials (2010/11 - 2017/18)

NOTE: For those completing multiple credentials, the time to completion ranged from 0 to 6 years.




