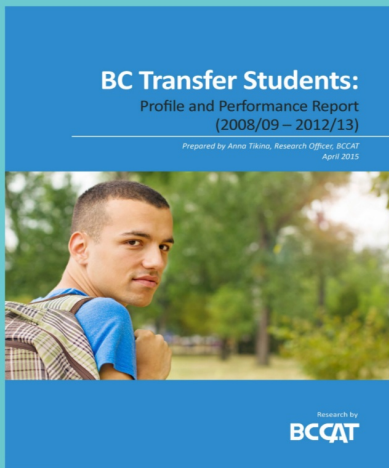

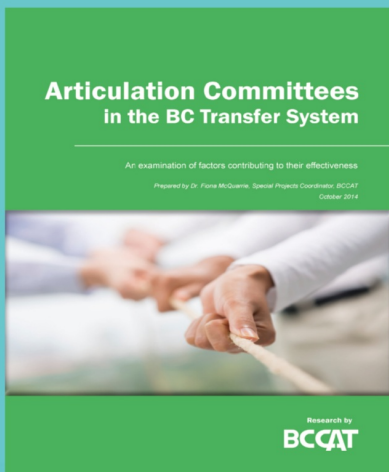
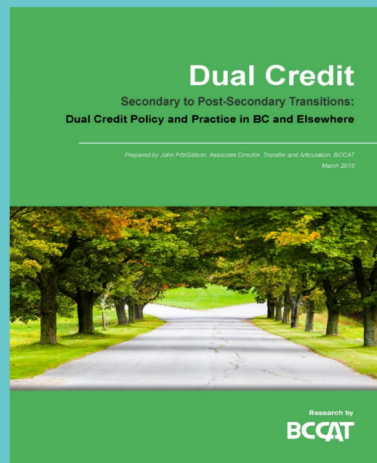
BCCAT Research

enriches understanding about student transfer, success, and mobility, and assesses the effectiveness of the BC Transfer System

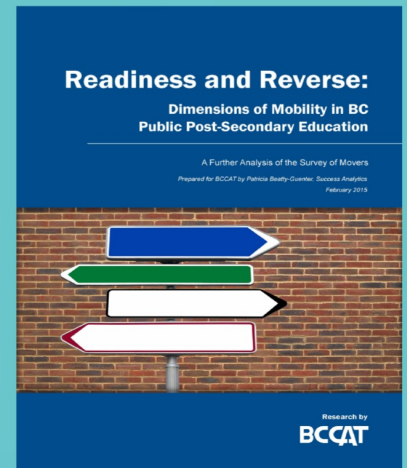


Transfer students perform as well as students who enter the post-secondary system immediately following secondary school graduation.

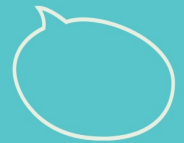

BCCAT works with and for BC Transfer System partners to advance transfer and mobility in BC.

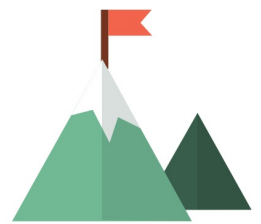
Information Facilitation Engagement

- ✱ BCCAT's Transfer Credit Evaluation System (TCES) links institutions and facilitates pathway options for students
- ✱ Proposals for changes regarding BC's associate degree credential are being submitted to the Ministry of Advanced Education. If approved, they will increase flexibility for students and institutions.
- ✱ The 2014 Joint Annual Meeting (JAM) drew 152 participants, including a number of representatives from other jurisdictions.
