

Transfer students perform as well as students who enter the post-secondary system immediately following secondary school graduation.


### **BCCAT** Research

enriches understanding about student transfer, success, and mobility, and assesses the effectiveness of the **BC** Transfer System




Dual credit options enable schools. districts, and postsecondary institutions to work out arrangements that meet the needs of their students.
